 First part of this day fresh breeze from S.W. and cloudy, latter part more moderate saw one ship of Blackfish and some shoals of Porpoise. At four o'clock P.M. made sail for home

Decr 10th 1852 Remarks onboard Friday Dec 10th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N.E. and cloudy, latter part more moderate and clear saw two Caiman back to end of this day
 Lat 18-40 Long 21-33

Decr 11th 1852 Remarks onboard Saturday Dec 11th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from N.E. and clear latter part more moderate and cloudy, saw two shoals of Porpoise
 Lat 18-39 Long 24-17

Decr 12th 1852 Remarks onboard Sunday Dec 12th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from N.E. and clear latter part fresh and squally, saw a Merchant Ship bound North
 Lat 18-40 Long 26-28

Decr 13th 1852 Remarks onboard Monday Dec 13th 1852
 First part of this day wind variable, fresh from N.E. and squally, latter part fresh breeze from S.W. and fair, saw a Merchant Ship bound North
 Lat 19-10 Long 28-27

Decr 14th 1852 Remarks onboard Tuesday Dec 14th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. and squally, latter part more moderate saw one Caiman also a Merchant Ship bound North
 Lat 19-27 Long 31-02

Decr 15th 1852 Remarks onboard Wednesday Dec 15th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. and squally, latter part moderate wind from S.W. Long 33-18 saw two Merchant Ships on board N. and S. and the other Dec 16th

Decr 16th 1852 Remarks onboard Thursday Dec 16th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. and squally, latter part light air S.E. and fair saw one Caiman
 Lat 20-27 Long 35-22

Decr 17th 1852 Remarks onboard Friday Dec 17th 1852
 First part of this day light air from S.W. and a squally, latter part light air from N.W. and fair, saw one shoal of Porpoise also a Merchant Ship bound North, so ends this day
 Lat 20-37 Long 36-21

Decr 18th 1852 Remarks onboard Saturday Dec 18th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from N.W. and fair, latter part fresh breeze from S.W. and squally, saw one Caiman and two Merchant Ships supposed to be a Caiman
 Lat 21-30 Long 37-40

Decr 19th 1852 Remarks onboard Sunday Dec 19th 1852
 First part of this day fresh breeze from S.E. and cloudy, latter part moderate and squally, killing old men from the S.W. Lat 21-09 Long 40-20

Decr 20th 1852 Remarks onboard Monday Dec 20th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.E. and cloudy, latter part fresh breeze from S.W. and squally, saw a shoal of Caiman commenced bathing the Starboard Core and Main Rigging
 Lat 21-27 Long 43-10

Decr 21th 1852 Remarks onboard Tuesday Dec 21th 1852
 First part of this day gentle breeze from S.W. and squally, latter part fresh breeze and cloudy, saw two Merchant Ships supposed to be a Caiman finished a bathing Core and aft so ends this day
