1853

Remarks onboard Tuesday Jan 4th 1853

First part of this day heavy gale from P East and squally with thunder lightning and rain at 11 AM the wind changed to the North and blew a perfect hurricane laid a hull at anchor at this could stand up and then hoar off used hauled 10 hours then hauled her too again

Jan 5th

1853

Remarks onboard Wednesday Jan 5th 1853

First part of this day heavy gale from North and squally with rain at 2 PM under Dry sail and three reefed Breeze sail latter part more moderate all this day in the Gulf Stream trying to get out
Lat 38 Long 71-40

Jan 6th

1853

Remarks onboard Thursday Jan 6th 1853

First part of this day fresh breeze from North and cloudy with fresh breeze latter part moderate and cloudy all this day in the Northern Edge of the Gulf Stream got out twice and set back again
Lat 38-34 Long 69-47

Jan 7th

1853

Remarks onboard Friday Jan 7th 1853

First part of this day calm and clear latter part fresh breeze from N.W. and at 4 PM came out of the Stream for the fourth time saw a Galley Door
Lat 38-27 Long 70-00

Jan 8th

1853

Remarks onboard Saturday Jan 8th 1853

First part of this day fresh breeze from West by North and clear latter part light air from N.W. latter part calm saw two men Bright light the Chain
Lat 40-08 Long 70-35
Sounded in 50 fathoms of water muddy Bottom

Jan 9th

1853

Remarks onboard Sunday Jan 9th 1853

First part of this day calm latter part gentle breeze from N.W. and clear at 10 AM made Gay Head bearing 12 P.M. Dist 15 Miles Spoke the Sch of Collings saw small other sails at sunset West Cape N.E. Dist 3 Miles

1853

Remarks onboard Monday Jan 10th 1853

First part of this day gentle breeze from N.W. and clear middle calm came to anchor back of Ledge the wind came to the Eastward got under way and came up latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and clear at 10 PM came to anchor in Provincetown Harbor so ends the day

Commencement of the Fourth Journal onboard Sch Waring Provincetown Massachusetts

April 27th

1853

Remarks onboard Wednesday April 27th 1853

At 10 AM left Provincetown Harbor with a light breeze from South and clear latter part gentle breeze from South by W and fair sailed in company with the cutter at sunset light four West Dist 10 Miles

April 28th

1853

Remarks onboard Thursday April 28th 1853

First part of this day calm and clear latter part gentle breeze from South and fair saw small sails
Lat 41-10 Long

April 29th

1853

Remarks onboard Friday April 29th 1853

First part of this day light air from South and foggy latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and clear and a number of sails heard the Whaler Blow
Lat 41-08 Long

April 30th

1853

Remarks onboard Saturday April 30th 1853

First part of this day gentle breeze from N.W. and clear latter part gentle breeze from North and fine saw small sail of Merchantmen saw three small of Schooners struck one did not get him one haul of Black
