May 13<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Friday May 13<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 All this day light breeze from South and fine  
 saw one sail bound North saw one shoal of  
 Porpoises at 6 A.M. raised a shoal of four  
 large sperm Whales toward and chased until  
 noon but could not get hold came on board  
 raised more Whales to windward at 4 P.M.  
 toward and struck one and killed him  
 Lat 30-18 Long 77-20

May 14<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Saturday May 14<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 First part of this day light air from South  
 and fine latter part fresh breeze from E.N.E.  
 and squally cuts in the Whales saw two shoals of  
 Lat 30-41 Long 76-34

May 15<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Sunday May 15<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 All this day fresh breeze from East and cloudy  
 at 6 A.M. started the work and finished killing  
 the Whale saw four shoals of Porpoises  
 Lat 30-15 Long 76-10

May 16<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Monday May 16<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 First part of this day gentle breeze from East  
 and fine latter part fresh breeze from N.E. and  
 cloudy saw two shoals of Porpoises and one sail  
 should claim the Whale the being 3<sup>rd</sup> Barrels  
 Lat 29-44 Long 76-06

May 17<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Tuesday May 17<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 All this day fresh breeze from N.E. and cloudy  
 1 in with a heavy swell finished killing the Whale  
 Lat 29-25 Long 77-11

May 18<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Wednesday May 18<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 All this day fresh breeze from N.E. and cloudy  
 started down the oil then being 3<sup>rd</sup> of the body  
 and washed up so ends this day all well  
 Lat 29-11 Long 77-11

May 19<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Thursday May 19<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 First part of this day light breeze from N.E.  
 and fair latter part fine spoke the ship  
 up and one month out again at 5 P.M.  
 raised a shoal of sperm Whales but did not get hold  
 Lat 29-15 Long 77-51

May 20<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Friday May 20<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 First part of this day calm latter part fresh  
 breeze from N.E. and squally wind two  
 Lat 29-49 Long 76-48

May 21<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Saturday May 21<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 All this day fresh breeze from N.E. and cloudy  
 saw one sperm whale bound N.W. also saw  
 one Bark and a whaler Brig, whalers also one other sail  
 Lat 29-02 Long 76-08

May 22<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Sunday May 22<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 First part of this day fresh breeze from N.E. and  
 cloudy latter part gentle breeze from N.E. and  
 fine saw one Whaling Bark and two cross hunters  
 Lat 28-18 Long 75-10

May 23<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Monday May 23<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 All this day gentle breeze from East and pleasant  
 spoke the ship and spoke of her Bedford 32 Months  
 out 70 sperm 130 Campbell's Gardner Whaler  
 saw two cross hunters bound North so ends this day  
 Lat 29-19 Long 75-39

May 24<sup>th</sup> Remarks onboard Tuesday May 24<sup>th</sup> 1833  
 First part of this day gentle breeze from East  
 and fine latter part gentle breeze from S.E. and  
 cloudy saw one shoal of Porpoises and one squid  
 2<sup>nd</sup> down the main Rigging and fourth mast  
 Rigging spoke the Bark N.D. Chase Chase  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Months out nothing so ends this day  
 Lat 30-22 Long 77-53
