May 25th 1833
Remarks onboard Wednesday May 25th 1833
First part of this day, heavy breeze from S.W. with a heavy squall of Thunder lightning rain and wind latter part gentle breeze from South and fine saw four Merchantmen bound to the Eastward
Lat 30-27 Long 76-48

May 26th 1833
Remarks onboard Thursday May 26th 1833
First part of this day, gentle breeze from North and fair latter part calm banded with Sea Breeze of Orlean's Breeze 292 Mounds out 10 1/2 lbs sperm saw a Merchant Brig bound to the South
Lat 30-43 Long 75-40

May 27th 1833
Remarks onboard Friday May 27th 1833
First part of this day, calm and clear latter gentle breeze from N.E. and fine saw two schools of Sperm one of Sperm saw the Virginia and one other ship
Lat 30-22 Long 75-37

May 28th 1833
Remarks onboard Saturday May 28th 1833
First part of this day, light air from South and fair latter part gentle breeze from South and squally with Thunder and lightning saw two Whalers a Schooner and a Merchant Brig spoke the ship got nothing bigger we saw her last saw small Sperm
Lat 29-38 Long 75-50

May 29th 1833
Remarks onboard Sunday May 29th 1833
First part of this day, squally with Thunder lightning and rain latter part gentle breeze from South and fine spoke the ship 2 Mounds out 15 1/2 lbs sperm spoke the School 13 Mounds out 75 sperm spoke the Alexander 1 Mound out 30 lbs sperm saw 4 sail bound South one N one East so ends the day

Remarks onboard Monday May 30th 1833
All this day, gentle breeze from North and fine saw one school of Sperm one of Sperm spoke the ship 1 Mound out 10 1/2 lbs sperm saw the Antarctic and Virginia also two other Whalers

May 31st 1833
Remarks onboard Tuesday May 31st 1833
First part of this day, calm latter part gentle breeze from N.E. and fine saw the Antarctic Alexander Virginia and two other Whaling Barks saw the ship spoke the ship cutting a Whale we supposed saw three schools of Sperm and Sperm
Lat 29-25 Long 75-48

June 1st 1833
Remarks onboard Wednesday June 1st 1833
All this day, gentle breeze from N.E. and fine saw one school of Sperm spoke the ship 15 days out spoke the ship Keogretta of Salem spoke the ship 9 Mounds out 120 lbs sperm spoke the ship Alexander saw the ship spoke the ship Virginia likewise one other Whaler and one Merchant Brig
Lat 29-54 Long 75-32

June 2nd 1833
Remarks onboard Thursday June 2nd 1833
All this day, gentle breeze from East and fine saw 3 sail off Schooner one Bark one ship all Whalers also one sail unknown saw one Sperm mounded the old ship and sent it to end the day
Lat 28-54 Long 76-35

June 3rd 1833
Remarks onboard Friday June 3rd 1833
All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. East and fair saw one Merchant Brig bound S. East
Lat 29-27 Long 78-08

June 4th 1833
Remarks onboard Saturday June 4th 1833
All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. to E.S.E. and fine saw one Merchantman supposed to be the one we saw yesterday so ends this day
