Remarks onboard Sunday June 5th 1853

First part of this day, light air from E. P. E. and fine middle calm latter part light air from North

First part of this day calm latter part gentle breeze from E. P. E. and fine at 4 1/2 school P. M. rained a lone sperm whale toward and gave chase but could not get hold so ended this day

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 7th 1853

First part of this day calm and fine latter part light air from East and fine saw two sperm whales

First part of this day light air from East and fine latter part gentle breeze from E. P. E. and fine saw two sail one bound South and two bound North

First part of this day light air from East and fine latter part calm and fine saw two sperm whales

Remarks onboard Friday June 10th 1853

First and latter part of this day calm middle light air from S. West and cloudy saw two shoals of Grampian saw the Walter D. also one other sail supposed to be a whaler yesterday sighted three humpback whales with the General dealer and went off duty

Remarks onboard Saturday June 11th 1853

all this day light air and flatting saw the schooner Walter D. also two other sail saw one shoal of Grampian

Remarks onboard Sunday June 12th 1853

First part of this day light air from S. E. and fine latter part gentle breeze from E. P. E. and cloudy saw the schooner Walter D. also four other sail spoke the Miller of Boston and Briggs 14 months 200 sperm also ship cypher and schooner shipwrecked got nothing better we saw them fast so ends this

Remarks onboard Monday June 13th 1853

all this day gentle breeze from E. P. E. and fine saw two sperm whales supposed to be a Grampian spoke the Starnapa of Liverpool and schooner, sailing, having taken 10 H. and were doing the first she had taken 11 months out saw 8 other whalers and 4 humpbackmen so ends this day

1853

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 14th 1853

all this day gentle breeze from E. P. E. and fine saw the schooner Walter D. also 5 other whalers

spoke the schooner and schooner, sailing, having taken 10 H. and were doing the first she had taken 11 months out saw 8 other whalers and 4 humpbackmen so ends this day

1853

Remarks onboard Wednesday June 15th 1853

all this day gentle breeze from E. P. E. and fine at noon raised a shoal of sperm whales toward struck one and killed and cut him in the Capt got propped up and nearly drowned spoke the schooner and schooner, sailing, having taken 10 H. and were doing the first she had taken 11 months out saw 8 other whalers and 4 humpbackmen so ends this day
