June 16th

1853

Remarks onboard Thursday June 16th 1853

All this day, gentle breeze from E and fine
saw small Whalman Commenced boiling
Saw the Vice of Duty with with his former Dickrell
Lat 31=50 Long 75=48

June 17th

1853

Remarks onboard Friday June 17th 1853

All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. to S.W.
and fine. Spoke the schooner with 43 lbs. Spruce
finished boiling, and started down S.E. and
10 Bolly, saw three Whalmen so ends this day.
Lat 32=02 Long 74=16

June 18th

1853

Remarks onboard Saturday June 18th 1853

First part of this day, light air from South. Middle
Calm latter part light air from S.W. Saw
two Merchants bound to the S.W. so ends this day.
Lat 32=26 Long 72=57

June 19th

1853

Remarks onboard Sunday June 19th 1853

All this day, light breeze from South to S.W. and
fine saw two shoals of Grampus one of Capricorn
and one of Blackfish saw the sail, bound to S.W.
Lat 32=19 Long 72=08

June 20th

1853

Remarks onboard Monday June 20th 1853

All this day, light air from S.W. and
fine saw two shoals of Grampus and a buck
Lat 32=08 Long 71=00

June 21st

1853

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 21st 1853

All this day, light air from S.W. and fine
set down the Head. May? Spoke the schooner
of Baltimore 10 Days out saw three other sail
Lat 32=14 Long 70=04

June 22nd

1853

Remarks onboard Wednesday June 22nd 1853

All this day, gentle breeze from W and fine spoke
the schooner taken morning since you spoke him last
saw 6 sail of Merchants 5 shoals of Grampus
Lat 32=09 Long 68=50

June 23rd

1853

Remarks onboard Thursday June 23rd 1853

All this day, gentle breeze from W and fine saw
a few shoals supposed to be Grampus also saw the
brig, school and fifteen sail of Merchants bound
South and East so ends this day, all well and fine
Lat 32=07 Long 67=03

June 24th

1853

Remarks onboard Friday June 24th 1853

All this day, gentle breeze from S.W. and fine
saw five Merchants bound to the South. Spoke the
brig, school and took one Hll. of Blackfish oil
from her at 12. Also saw Bermuda bearing East
Dist 15 Miles so ends this day all comfortable
Lat 32=07 Long 67=03

June 25th

1853

Remarks onboard Saturday June 25th 1853

First part of this day wind from W and fine
latter part light air from S.W. and squally
saw one shoal of Grampus spoke the brig,
school took onboard 1000 lbs of Oil and 4 Hlls of
Potatoes saw two Merchants at sunset Bermuda
Dist 10 Miles to Day. Sailed 10 miles to Day. Sailed
came on Duty being much better so ends this day
Lat 32=08 Long 65=30

June 26th

1853

Remarks onboard Sunday June 26th 1853

All this day, light air from S.W. and squally
saw the brig, school saw one Grampus
Lat 32=08 Long 63=30

June 27th

1853

Remarks onboard Monday June 27th 1853

First part of this day, light air from S.W. and
cloudy latter part gentle breeze from S.W. to
S.E. and squally. Saw the schooner drewed
the back chain went out of the keel
Lat 32=12 Long 62=12

June 28th

1853

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 28th 1853

First part of this day light air from S.W. and
cloudy latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and
fair saw the schooner and one shoal of Grampus
Lat 32=49 Long 61=40
