light air from N.E. at 4 o'clock. Part of rainier time.

1857. April 27. Remarks on board Friday, April 27. 1857.
 Light part of this day, gentle breeze from N.W.
 latter part light air from West spoke to Lake
 Washington of Puget Sound and into it.

April 22nd Remarks on board Saturday April 22nd 1854
First part of this day gentle breeze from N.E.
latter part light air from S.E. saw no signs
of Duckfish or Porpoise part of Crabs were
seen.

April 25th 1854. Lat 34-00 Long 70-45
 Remarks on board Sunday April 25th 1854.
 First part of the night was calm to S.W.
 and finally with Thunder Lightning and rain.
 latter part fresh gale from N.W. with rain.
 Saw five sail of Merchants. The Man
 Henry Bain shipped for Cook proved to be
 incompetent to do his duty in the least respect.
 he left his station and put in Sunday
 leaving the Steward most incompetent and
 put in George Blumrich to ride this day.

 craft and took sail for the first time
 April 26 Lat 22-09 Long 72-17
