All this day, fresh breeze from N.E. by E and cloudy, & squally, so much this day, all well

Lat 29° 53' Long 59° 48'
Remarks onboard Tuesday
First part of this day, gentle breeze from N.E. by E latter part light air from N. to N.W. and fine saw one shoal of Trampahul & one of Dorville Lat 29° 47' Long 58° 55'

Remarks onboard Wednesday
All this day, calm and clear saw one shoal of Trampahul cut the Luck Cords of the Tarbait and passed it over it being, at night and, set down the Mast Rigging and at night

Lat 29° 51' Long 58° 52'
Remarks onboard Thursday
First part of the day light air from N.E. and pleasant Middle of latter part a very great calm saw one shoal of Trampahul & one of Dorville Lat 30° 05' Long 58° 34'

Remarks onboard Friday
First part of this day, a dead calm Middle light breeze from N.E. by E latter part more moderate than the first part so ends this day, all well

Lat 30° 22' Long 58° 14'
Remarks onboard Saturday
First part of this day, a living, calm latter part light air from N.E. by E and fine saw one shoal of Trampahul & one of Dorville caught one Calman the first one for the voyage Lat 31° 51' Long 57° 21'

Remarks onboard Sunday
First part of this day, light air from N.E. by E and fine latter part light air from N.E. and cloudy, so ends this day
Lat 32° 52' Long 56° 00'

Remarks onboard Monday
All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. and fine saw at Whaling, Bark also two other sail all standing, to the South saw two small breeches Lat 33° 24' Long 55° 24'

Remarks onboard Tuesday
All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. and fair with scattering clouds saw one sail and three breeches all stood to a Trampahul Lat 33° 10' Long 54° 37'

Remarks onboard Wednesday
All this day, rather fresh breeze from E and cloudy, but disposed high, we were at sea the ship was under two breeches and had one very loud noise twice Lat 33° 05' Long 54° 08'

Remarks onboard Thursday
All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. and fair saw one bark the Bark the Bark of Rev. Bedford Macomber Master of the out-Dean. Lat 32° 45' 04' Long 53° 50'

Remarks onboard Friday
All this day, gentle breeze from S.E. to South saw the Bark the Bark also one other bark could not ascertain what it was Lat 32° 45' Long 52° 03'

Remarks onboard Saturday
First part of this day, gentle breeze from South and cloudy latter part fresh breeze from S.E. by E and cloudy saw one shoal of Trampahul saw two more shoals Lat 32° 37' Long 49° 55'

Remarks onboard Sunday
First part of this day, gentle breeze from S.E. with a squall of wind and rain from S.W. latter part gentle breeze from S.W. and rainy, saw a great abundance of fresh water Lat 32° 14' Long 48° 21'
