Dec 20th 1855 Remarks onboard Thursday
first part Moderate breeze
from the West at 8 P.M. the
Wind come with a squall from
the North let go the Starboard
Anchor at 8 o'clock Saw two
Whales chased them outside
the reef and lost sight of them
fresh gales and Squally

Dec 21st 1855 Remarks onboard Friday
all this day fresh gales from
the S.E.

Dec 22nd 1855 Remarks onboard Saturday
first part fresh gales from
the S.E. Middle more moderate
latter part fresh gales from
the E.S.E. and thick Weather

Dec 23rd 1855 Remarks onboard Sunday
first part Moderate breeze from
the S.E. and fine Weather Middle
part the same latter part fresh
breeze from the North and fine

Dec 24th 1855 Remarks onboard Monday
first part fresh breeze from the
North Middle and latter part
more moderate and fine Weather
at 6 o'clock got under way and
run out of the Bay to make a
look

Dec 25th 1855 Remarks onboard Tuesday
first part fresh breeze from the
North at 3 P.M. came to anchor
in the Bay Middle part more moderate
at 6 A.M. got under way latter part
the Wind S.W. and fine weather

Dec 26th 1855 Remarks onboard Wednesday
all this day Moderate breeze from
the S.E. and fine weather at 4 P.M.
came to anchor at 6 A.M. got under
way and run out the Bay

Dec 27th 1855 Remarks onboard Thursday
first part fresh breeze from the
S.E. and cloudy at 5 P.M. came to
anchor in 11 fathoms 10 miles to the
North off Cintra Bay Coast Africa
Middle part more moderate at 6 A.M.
got under way latter part fresh breeze
and fine Weather

Dec 28th 1855 Remarks onboard Friday
first part Moderate breeze from
the North at 5 P.M. took in sail
Middle part Calm at 7 A.M. made
Sail latter part Moderate breeze
from the Westward and fine weather

Dec 29th 1855 Remarks onboard Saturday
first and Middle parts Moderate
breeze from the S.W. and fine weather
at 5 P.M. came to anchor at 6 o'clock
got under way latter part fresh
breeze from the E.S.E. at noon
came to anchor in Cintra Bay
