6 A.M. toward the Boats at 7 A.M.
A Whale and killed her & took
her alongside the John C. Smith
at 8 A.M. Capt Fisher struck &
killed A Whale to Seward came
onboard & got the Sch under way
and run down to the Whale at
10 took it alongside and commen-
cing cutting so ends this day

1856

Remarks onboard Sunday
first part fresh breeze from the
North at 2 P.M. finish cutting
and got under way at 4 came
to Anchor in the Bay Middle
and latter part fresh gales from
the S & S & E

Feb 11th
1856

Remarks onboard Monday
all this day fresh gales from the
S & S & E at 6 A.M. commenced Boiling

Feb 12th
1856

Remarks onboard Tuesday
all this day fresh gales from the
S & S & E at noon finish Boiling

Feb 13th
1856

Remarks onboard Wednesday
first part moderate breeze from
the S & S & E at 6 A.M. toward the
Boats and took A Cruise at 8
came onboard

Feb 14th
1856

Remarks onboard Thursday
first part moderate and fine
delivered the Oil to the C. & Dickson
and S. R. Loper latter part fresh
breeze from the S & S & E

moderate at 6 A.M. toward the
Boats at 8 saw A Whale
at 10 came onboard latter part
fresh gales from the S & S & E

1856

Remarks onboard Tuesday
all this day fresh gales from
the S & S & E and thick weather

Feb 20th
1856

Remarks onboard Wednesday
all this day fresh gales from the
S & S & E at 9 A.M. broke the Starboard
Chain latter part employed Sweep-
ing for the Anchor

Feb 21st
1856

Remarks onboard Thursday
first part fresh gales from the S & S & E
at 4 P.M. got the Anchor and
moored the Ship middle part more
moderate latter part the same

Feb 22nd
1856

Remarks onboard Friday
all this day fresh breeze and fine
at 3 P.M. saw A Whale the vessel
struck it killed her took it along-
side the S. R. Loper
