the Bay. the Bark Spartan laying
off and on with 250 bls. h. the Bark
John & Eleazbeth 500 bls. Bound
home. Sent A Boat in for letters

the S.E. and fine weather

all this day Moderate breeze from
the S.E. and fine weather at 8 A.M.

E. Sickson in Company and
bid adieu to Fore Bay for this
Season

Apr 27th 1856 Remarks on board Sunday
all this day Moderate breeze from
the S.E. and Cloudy at 6 P.M. took
in Sail at 8 A.M. Saw A shoal of
Sperm Whales Bound to Winchward
Lat 23.18 Long 17.55

Apr 28th 1856 Remarks on board Monday
all this day fresh gales from the E. at
6 A.M. made Sail at 8. saw Sperm Whales at 10
took in the mainsail & flog set the topsail
Lat 23.14 Long 17.40
