Mar 26<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Tues  
 First part of this day strong trades at one p.m. Capt Hodges went on shore to cut wood at 6 returned middle part calm latter part light air from the S.W. at 6 A.M. weighed anchor at 8 went to sea at 9 Spoke the Barque Parker Cook of Provincetown 11 months out 2300 lbs Spum oil all hands employed mending the Foresail So ends this day

Mar 27<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Friday  
 All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from the E.S.E. at 6 p.m. came to anchor in Sand Bay in company with Barque Parker Cook at 6 A.M. got under way at 8 A.M. we saw the Barque Lady Suffolk lower her boats for Spum Whales we then our boats and gave chase So ends this day

Mar 28<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Saturday  
 First and middle part of these 24 hours calm at 3 p.m. gave up the chase. Lady Suffolk got 3 Whales Guss Bruce got one Whale bound N.W. latter part light air from the E.S.E. So 4 Sails of Whalemans in sight So ends this day

Mar 29<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Sunday  
 First part of this day strong trades at 4 p.m. came to anchor in Sand Bay in company with Guss Bruce Lady Suffolk & Antarctic at 7 A.M. Capt H forbid all hands going in swimming on account of the Sharks. John Davis & John Poyl disabade John & Capt H then tied them in the riggin. John Poyl was daisy too the Capt then put him in irons So ends this day

Mar 30<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Monday  
 First & middle part of these 24 hours calm at 6 p.m. Capt took John Poyl out of irons at 6 A.M. made sail & went to sea latter part light air from the S.W. So ends these 24 hours

Mar 31<sup>th</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Tuesday  
 All of these 24 hours light baffling winds at 1 p.m. came to anchor at the watering place in Sand Bay. we then went on shore & filed 100 lbs of water at 7 A.M. made sail & went to sea at 11 finished stowing down the water saw 4 Sails of Whalemans

Apr 1<sup>st</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Wednesday  
 First part of these 24 hours calm at 6 p.m. took in sail middle part heavy squalls with rain at 6 A.M. made sail at 7 lowerd the boats for a Kumpback at 10 gave up the chase latter part light air from the S.W. cruising off the chalk cliffs Sand Bay

April 2<sup>nd</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Thursday  
 First & middle part of these 24 hours light baffling winds from the westward at 1 p.m. saw a shoal of Blackfish toward the boats and gave chase the fish was wild and could not get hold at 3 came on board 4 Sails of Whalemans in sight gamel with the Parker Cook

April 3<sup>rd</sup> 1857  
 Remarks onboard Friday  
 First part of these 24 hours light baffling winds running down the South side Saint Jommings in company with the Barque Parker Cook at one p.m. lowerd the boom for Blackfish the log struck and drew in at 6 took in sail at 6 A.M. made sail at 9 A.M. made the S.W. watch So ends this day
