April 4th

1857

Remarks onboard Saturday

All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from the N.E. at 1 p.m. came too anchor on the N.W. side of Island of Savatoh in 4 f. of water in co with Parker boat at 2 went on shore too cut wood at 6 returned and then gained with the Parker boat at 8 A.M. Parker boat went too sea at 7 went on shore wooding at noon returned So ends this day

April 5th

1857

Remarks onboard Sunday

All of this day light baffling winds at 3 p.m. finished wooding at 5 A.M. made sail and went too sea Saw one Merchantman So ends this day

April 6th

1857

Remarks onboard Monday

All these 24 hours light baffling winds at 4 p.m. Saw a shoal of Blackfish at 6 took in sail at 7 A.M. made all sail Saw one Merchantman So ends

April 7th

1857

Remarks onboard Tuesday

All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from the S.W. at one p.m. came too anchor at Port Salute on the South side of Saint Dominge at 2 p.m. the Harbor watch went on liberty Cpt Holmes went on shore and traded & all pork & all Beef for potatoes at 7 the Harbor watch returned except George Snow & Louis Montigue and William Jamison at 6 A.M. Cpt Holmes went on shore too look for the men found George & Louis Montigue then came onboard and made sail and went too sea

April 8th

1857

Continued

Remarks onboard Wednesday

First and middle part of this day gentle breeze from the S.W. Stearing N.W. took out the main hole and stowed down the Foresail & got Saw several Sails of Merchantman at 6 p.m. took in mainsail & light Sails shape tiperoon baring N.W. 15 miles distance at 6 A.M. made all sail and Steared N.E. So ends this day

April 9th

1857

Remarks onboard Thursday

First and middle part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from the N.E. at 4 p.m. made the South side of Ruby baring N.W. 18 miles distance at 6 p.m. Shortend sail at 6 A.M. made sail and run down the South side of Ruby at 8 A.M. Saw Shoal of Blackfish Saw 4 Sails of Merchantman latter part more moderate So ends these 24 hours

April 10th

1857

Remarks onboard Friday

All of these 24 hours gentle N.E. trades at 6 p.m. took in the light Sails at 6 A.M. set them again and run down the South side of Ruby Saw 5 Sails of Merchantman Stearing W by N So ends this day

April 11th

1857

Remarks onboard Saturday

All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from the S.E. Stearing W by N took the Stern Boat on deck for repairs caught too Dolphin Saw a Brig supposed to be a Merchantman Stearing W set up the head rigger So ends this day

April 12th

1857

Remarks onboard Sunday

All these 24 hours gentle breeze from the S.E. and fine weather So ends this day
