First part of this day fresh breeze from ENE  
cloudy at one pm made the N.W. Side of Cuba  
at 3 tock in the mainsail and set the  
Storm Trysail at 4 AM made all sail again  
latter part of this day more moderate saw eight  
sails supposed them to be Merchantman bound  
out of the Bay Lat 23.46 Long 81.35

June 17<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Wednesday June 17<sup>th</sup>  
First part of this day fresh breeze from E by S  
at 4 pm spoke a Scho from Pensacola bound to  
Boston at 8 AM made cargo fast Reef Sigh  
hurring N.W. distance 10 miles latter part of  
this day gentle breeze from ENE and fine weather  
Saw 10 Sails of Merchantman Lat 25.31 Long 80.00

June 18<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Thursday June 18<sup>th</sup>  
First and middle part of this day gentle  
breeze from S E and fine weather latter part  
of this day fresh breeze from S E to S W  
one school of Porpoises saw 6 Sails supposed  
them to be Merchantman Lat 28.34 Long 80.00

June 19<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Friday June 19<sup>th</sup>  
First part of this day gentle breeze from  
S E and fine weather middle part Squalls  
of rain latter part fine weather weather saw  
scho bound N.W. 2935 Lat Long 77.00

June 20<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Saturday June 20<sup>th</sup>  
First part of this day gentle breeze from  
S E and cloudy middle and latter part  
Squally saw one school of Porpoises saw one  
school of Blackfish Lat 30.35 Long 76.40

June 21<sup>st</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Sunday June 21<sup>st</sup>  
All of this day gentle breeze from S E with  
squalls so ends this day Lat 31.31 Long 76.30

Remarks onboard Monday June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1857  
All of these twenty 2 hours gentle breeze from S E  
and squalls of rain saw Grampuses saw one sail  
supposed to be a Merchantman bound N.W.  
Lat 31.37 Long 74.11

June 23<sup>rd</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Tuesday June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1857  
All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from S W  
and squally spoke the Barque Albert 13 days from  
New York bound to Savannah saw one school of  
Porpoises struck on and lost it again Lat Long

June 24<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Wednesday June 24<sup>th</sup> 1857  
First part of this day fresh breeze from  
S W with squalls of rain middle and latter  
part fresh breeze from E S E and cloudy  
caught one dolphin saw 2 Sails supposed them  
to be Merchantman Lat 31.46 Long 71.31

June 25<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Thursday June 25<sup>th</sup>  
First and middle part of this day gentle  
breeze from S E and cloudy latter part  
calm with much rain so ends this day

June 26<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Friday June 26<sup>th</sup> 1857  
First and middle part of this day heavy  
squalls from N.W. latter part Wind N.W.  
and fine weather saw one school of Porpoises  
saw 2 Sails of Merchantman Lat 31.23 Long 68.12

June 27<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Saturday June 27<sup>th</sup> 1857  
First and middle part of this day gentle  
breeze from S W and fine weather saw two  
Sails supposed them to be Merchantman  
latter part fresh breeze from S W on  
bent the new foresail and bent the old one  
Sunday Lat 32.21 Long 66.33

June 28<sup>th</sup>  
1857

Remarks onboard Sunday June 28<sup>th</sup> 1857  
All of this day gentle breeze from S W and fine  
at 7 AM made the Island of Bermuda hurring  
E 12 miles distance so ends this day
