Remarks onboard Sunday Aug 23th 1857
First and middle part of this day fresh breeze from N.E. and cloudy. Saw three Whale Ships laying off Fayal. Spook Brig Hopeton of Lipecan 2 months out clean latter part fresh breeze from S.W. and Smoky at Sundown. Fayal herring. E.N.E. 2 miles distance Benjamin Worth Sick and off duty. So ends these 24 hours

Aug 24th

1857

Remarks onboard Monday Aug 24th
First part of this day gentle breeze from N.West and fine weather at 3 o'clock p.m. came to anchor in Fayal Harbor in sight of Watter saw two ships laying off and on at Fayal middle part tremendous squalls from S.W. to S.East at 4 o'clock A.M. the Starboard Watch went on shore on 24 hours liberty latter part of this day tremendous squalls from North to N.East at 10 A.M. French Brig dragged her anchors and went to sea So ends these 24 hours

Aug 25th

1857

Remarks onboard Tuesday Aug 25th
First part of these 24 hours tremendous gales from N.East and a heavy sea heaving in the Harbor from the West middle and latter part more moderate at 4 A.M. all of the Liberty Men came on board So ends this day Benjamin Worth Sick and off duty

Aug 26th

1857

Continued
Remarks onboard Wednesday Aug 26th
First and middle part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from N.East and clear weather Broke out the Fresh Watter Casks and put buckets on them at 9 A.M. the Starboard Watch went on shore on 24 hours liberty latter part more moderate So ends this day

Aug 27th

1857

Remarks onboard Thursday Aug 27th
All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from N.East and fine weather at 6 A.M. sent the Watter Casks on shore to be filled at 9 the Starboard Watch returned Discharged Benjamin Worth and shipped three Portagues

Aug 28th

1857

Remarks onboard Friday Aug 28th
First part of this day gentle breeze from N.East and fine took 30 bbls of Watter on board and recruits at 6 p.m. weighed anchor and went to sea middle part calm latter part gentle breeze from N.West and fine weather on bent the chains and stowed them in the hold So ends this day

Aug 29th

1857

Remarks onboard Saturday Aug 29th
First part of this day gentle breeze from N.West and cloudy took Daniel Wells out of the Forecassel and put him in Shipkeeper also put George B. Snow in Boatsteerer middle and latter part of this day fresh breeze from North and cloudy saw two Sails supposed them to be Merchantmen
