First part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from West and fine weather middle and latter part fresh breeze from N East and cloudy

Sept 21th
1857

Remarks onboard Monday Sept 21th 1857
All of these 24 hours gentle breeze from N East and fine weather spoke the Barque Dian of Amsterdam and from New York 12 days Lat 37.33 Long 47.1

Sept 22th
1857

Remarks onboard Tuesday Sept 22th 1857
First part of this day gentle breeze from N East and fine weather middle and latter part gentle breeze from West and fine saw one Shoal of Grampuses caught six dolphins saw a ship supposed to be a merchantmen steering N East Lat 37.44 Long 47.1

Sept 23th
1857

Remarks onboard Wednesday Sept 23th 1857
First and middle part of this day gentle breeze from West and fine weather latter part fresh breeze from S East and cloudy saw a ship steering N W Lat 37.55 Long 47.1

Sept 24th
1857

Remarks onboard Thursday Sept 24th 1857
First and middle part of this day fresh breeze from S East and cloudy latter part fresh breeze from S W saw two pieces of squid saw a brig steering N East Lat 40.33 Long 46.56

Sept 25th
1857

Remarks onboard Friday Sept 25th 1857
First and middle part of this day fresh breeze from South too S East and Smoky latter part gentle breeze from N W West and cloudy at 11 A.M. raised a large Shoal of Small Spum Whales at 12 toward three Boats and gave chase so ends this day Lat 40.21 Long 46.49

Sept 26th
1857

Remarks onboard Saturday Sept 26th 1857
First and middle part of these 24 hours gentle breeze from N W West at 2 P.M. lost sight of the Whales and came on board saw them one out of the Boats Whales going quick too the N East at 3 P.M. raised the Whales again bound too the S W toward the two Starboard Boats and gave chase at Sandown the Waist Boat went along side of a Small Whale and missed then chased until dark at 7 came on board Whales bound N W latter part of this day calm Lat 40.29 Long 46.30

Sept 27th
1857

Remarks onboard Sunday Sept 27th 1857
First part of this day gentle breeze from N W West and fine weather saw one Shoal of Porpoises middle and latter part tremulous gales from South too N West with Squalls laying too under too reefed Foresail heading to Northward so ends these 24 hours No at
