While taking in the main lower topsail, both buntlines parted and we had quite a job to secure the sail, and didn't do it till it had ripped off the jacksay the whole length of the yard. Suffered other small damages, too numerous to mention here. Barometer went down to 29.26.

Thursday-6-

Calm all day. All hands employed in repairing damage sustained yesterday.

Friday-7-

Calm all day. Set up rigging fore and aft. And it needed it after the gale.

Saturday-8-

Day started with light winds from the N. And ended with light winds from the N. Weather rather cloudy, but barometer is high. At sunrise saw a school of small whales and got one. Cut it in and made sail to go to the south. At 11.30 a.m. saw another school and got a big whale out of it. Got it alongside to late to start cutting.

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Sunday-9-

Very light N.W. winds all day. Put in whale and braced forward on starboard tack under short sail.

Monday-10-

Moderate S.W. winds all day and good weather. Vessel on starboard tack all day under short sail, heading about S.S.E. Saw a steamer. We are still Boiling.

Tuesday-11-

Light winds from S.W., and fine weather all day. Vessel has been going E.S.E. All day. Got through boiling.

Calm all day.

Very light easterly winds and nice clear weather all day. Vessel cruising under all sail. Stowed 93 barrels of oil today.
