Saturday-12.

Very light air from S.W. and fine weather. Vessel cruising under all sail. At sun up saw a school of whales also one large whale. Did not get any.

Sunday-13.

Fair breeze from E.N.E. and fine weather. Vessel cruising under all sail. Saw lots of grampuses.

Monday-14.

Strong N.E. winds and fair weather. Vessel cruising under upper topsails. Grampuses and porpoises galore. Saw a steamer bound N.E. At 5.30 P.M. saw a school of whales and got 2.

Tuesday-15.

Light N.E. winds and fair weather, but rough. but in whales. Saw a large whale at sunrise but it was too rough to lower.

Wednesday-16.

Moderate S.W. winds and fair weather. Vessel cruising under good sail. At 9.30 A.M. saw a school of small whales and got two. Cut them in and braced forward on starboard tack.

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Thursday-17.

Strong S.E. winds and equally weather. Vessel cruising. Saw two schools of sperm whales but were not able to get any. Going to windward very fast.

Friday-18.

Strong S.E. winds and seas very rough. Vessel cruising under small sail. Saw plenty grampuses.

Saturday-19.

Strong easterly winds and high seas. Vessel cruising under upper topsails. Stowed 60 bbls of oil. Saw a school of whales at noon, struck one but iron drew and the rest went to windward and didn't have another chance.

Sunday-20.

Strong easterly winds and very rough. Vessel cruising under upper topsails. At 2.30 P.M. saw a bunch of large bulls and got one.

Monday-21.

Light easterly to S.E. winds and fair weather. Seas still big and irregular. Cut in whale and braced forward on port tack.
