Sunday Feb the 1st commences with light winds and pleasant
 weather, bent a new Spanker at 11 AM, Middle and
 Lat 57.05 later part the same took a luber by measuring
 Lon 55.10 the distance of the sun from the moon, so ends
 took a luber by this day, all hands, well except 2 hurt falling down the
 m - the 2nd day the 2nd commences with light breezes from the S.W.
 Monday Feb the 2nd commences with light breezes from the S.W.
 Lat 58.06 East, Middle and later part the same an bent the span
 Lon 54.02 der and fitted it to set so ends this day
 Tuesday Feb the 3rd commences with fresh breezes from the S.W.
 and pleasant weather Middle and later part
 Lat 59.40 the same all sail set, wind left steering S.W.
 Lon 55.07 all hands employed in ships duty so ends this day
 Wednesday Feb the 4th commences with fresh breezes and smoky
 weather, at 6 AM, took in the Star and M. Studing sail
 Lat 59.50 Middle part squally with rain wind shaverable
 Lon 55.10 later part standing on the starboard tack took
 in all sail, but still rec'd M. Studing sail and
 T. sail, at 10 PM, wore ship at 10 PM, heading East,
 wind S.W., heavy gales split the T. S. S. so ends this
 Thursday Feb the 5th commences with heavy gales from
 Lat 40.19 the S. with rain, Middle part the same gale
 Lon 55.10 states at 4 PM, Made sail bent a new T. S. S.
 at 11 PM so ends this day course S.W. when shown
 Friday Feb the 6th commences with fresh gales from
 the south, wore ship at 12 PM, heading to the
 Lat 59.58 westward Middle part calm board the S. Boat
 Lon 55.36 at 10 PM to pick up some birds later part light
 breezes from the N.W., all hands employed in ships duty
 Saturday Feb the 7th commences with fresh breezes from the S.W.
 and pleasant weather bent down the M. R. yard at 4 PM
 Lat 41.14 at 8 AM squally took in the topgallant sails and
 Lon 56.00 flying gill at 10 AM, duble reefed the T. top sail wind
 haling to the S.W. at 12 PM, took R. M. B.
 at 4 PM shook out the reefs and made sail at 10 PM
 Tacked ship heading to the westward

Ship Warsaw Bound to the N.W. Coast

Sunday Feb the 8th commences with light breezes
 from the S.W. and fine weather Middle
 Lat 41.02 S.W. and later part the same heading
 Lon 56.17 from S.W. to N.W. so ends this day
 Monday Feb the 9th commences with light breezes
 from the S.W. and calm weather at 4 PM
 Lat 42.56 set the T. Studing sail, Middle part fine breezes
 Lon 57.36 and smoky weather set the L. Studing sail later
 part set 2 fin backs all hands employed in ships
 duty set up the M. Y. backstays so ends this day
 Tuesday Feb the 10th commences with fine breezes from
 S.W. the Northward and smoky weather Middle and
 Lat 44.26 later part the same all hands employed
 Lon 59.46 in ships duty so ends this day
 Wednesday Feb the 11th commences with fresh breezes
 from the S.W. and Westward at 8 AM took
 Lat 45.50 in the Studing sails Middle part wind
 Lon 61.15 hauld to the westward braced up later
 part calm so ends this day
 Thursday Feb the 12th commences with light
 breezes from the Eastward and foggy took
 Lat 46 S.W. a luber by measuring the distance of the sun
 from the moon and found that our Lon was 61.18
 at 3 AM Middle part the same later part sent out
 the T. Studing sail and hauld to the S.W.
 all hands employed in ships duty making Provisions
 Friday Feb the 13th commences with light breezes from
 the Northward and thick fog Middle part
 Lat 48.08 took fog with sharp lightning short sail later
 Lon 62.16 part made sale fog light up Made the Land
 sail cold it Port Desire, so ends this day
 Saturday Feb the 14th commences with fresh breezes from the South
 Lat 47.44 Tacked ship at 2 PM, took in the T. S. S. Middle and
 Lon 62.46 later part calm heading to the E.W. all hands
 employed in ships duty
