Sunday Feb 15th commences with light breezes and calms from the
 course south and west at 8 P.M. light breezes from the N
 Lat 47.08 and west squared the yards and made sail
 Lon 68.25 S Steering South Middle and later part fresh
 gales fine weather so ends this day

Monday Feb 16th commences with fresh gales from the
 S and W, and pleasant weather Middle part
 Lat 44.45 and hals to the S and E, later part wind
 Lon 68.43 S hals to the E, so ends this day

Tuesday Feb 17th commences with fresh gales from
 the East and spoke the Barque Byron from
 S 8 E the ship has with 1500 barrels of blubber oil
 Lat 43.22 bound home and shipped 5 men from
 Lon 67.16 her brace forward and beding to the South Shorten
 sail Middle part fresh gales, later part light wind
 so ends this day later part made sail

Wednesday Feb 18th commences with light winds from
 the Eastward and thick weather Middle part
 fresh breezes from the N and W, made the land at 5
 Lat 40.22 E 8 S at 10, cut most part of bridle piece, steering E 8 S
 Lon 66.16 hauld up E and stood in for it so ends this day

Thursday Feb 19th commences with fresh breezes from
 the Westward running down the land left star
 Lat 38.22 on land on the Lord's hand Middle part
 Lon 65.16 light breezes from the S and E, steering South by
 W, later part fresh breezes running down the
 land at 12 P.M. up with the channel the E part

Friday Feb 20th commences with fresh breezes from
 the S and E running down the land at 4 P.M.
 Lat 35.22 up with the W part of the channel the heaviest
 Lon 64.16 on our quarter at 6 A.M. left hand island on our
 bow, doubled round and stood out there the passage
 passing east point and false cape at 10 A.M. steered
 W 8 S Middle part fresh gales with squalls shorten sail
 at 12 A.M. to double reef top sails later part fresh gales
 from the Westward made the Sieges at 8 P.M. so ends this day

Saturday Feb 21st commences with fresh gales from the N and W
 close by beding past the Sieges at 2 A.M. steering N 8 E Short sail
 Lat 36.25 Middle part fresh gales with squalls of hail later
 Lon 60.50 W part made sail saw 2 ships standing to the E
 one ship at 5 P.M. heading to the N and W

Sunday Feb 22nd commences with fresh gales from
 the Westward with squalls of rain and hail
 Lat 34.22 made the Sieges at 1 A.M. and past them
 Lon 58.22 at 4 A.M. double reef top sails at 6 A.M. Made
 the false cape at 12 and wore ship wind hals to
 W 8 S the S and E square the yards and part the algonnes
 at 5 P.M. so ends this day

Monday Feb 23rd commences with fine breezes from the
 W 8 S and E, at 4 A.M. wind hals to the N and W
 Lat 32.22 with squalls double reefed the top sails and furled
 Lon 56.22 the gill and No 5 Middle part heavy squalls with hail
 Short sail differing from gill and Main sail hals
 to set and hulk reef top sail so ends this day
 signalled saw a whale ship steering eastward

Tuesday Feb 24th commences with fresh gales from
 the Westward with squalls of hail wore ship
 Lat 30.22 at 1 P.M. heading W 8 S Short sail made
 Lon 54.22 the Main sail and shock out a reef in fore
 Middle part fresh breezes with squalls the Blacksmith
 hurt his foot by the left parting on the W part wore
 ship heading to the Westward

Wednesday Feb 25th commences with fresh breezes from
 the Northward with squalls Middle part the same
 spoke the ship Esalator of N.B. 48 months out of
 spin later part fresh gales heading S 8 W
 Lat 28.22 hals see Short sail according to the wind
 Lon 52.22

Thursday Feb 26th commences with fresh gales from the
 W 8 S Westward wind hals to the S and W small
 Lat 26.22 sail steering W 8 S, choppy with squalls took in
 Lon 50.22 the Main sail later part light breezes heading
 W 8 S heavy swell saw several finbacks
