from the S and W North and later part the same
Lat 54.26 with the and foggy weather heading from S by W to W
Lon 79.26 no observation this day birds very plenty

Monday Mar the 2d commences with fresh breezes from the
S and W with fog short sail Middle part
Lat 55.20 thick fog with rain later part wind shifts to
Lon 80.45 the S and W light breeze made sail right away
and heavy weather so ends this day

Tuesday Mar the 3d commences with light breezes from the W
cloudy and thick Middle part wind now to the S and W
Lat 54.04 with fine breeze heading from N.W. to N.E.
Lon 79.54 later part fresh breeze and squally all sail set
saw 2 sails standing the same way with ours

Wednesday Mar the 4th commences with fresh breezes coming
from N.W. from W to S.W. backed ship at 5 AM heading to
the W.ward exchanged coulers with a top sail
Lat 53.46 schooner and proved to be a Hamburger saw a big
Lon 79.47 to seaward at 8 AM shorter sail squally at 9 AM
all sail in but duble reef M.S. and fore sail saw some
Meeters, heavy sea at 8 PM made sail so ends this day

Thursday Mar the 5th commences with light breezes from the N and W
both calms with a heavy sea held up the coarces
Lat 53.22 Middle part light breeze from the Westward Later part
Lon 78.54 fine breeze with squalls saw a dark on the horizon to the W
backed ship at 9 AM heading N.W. so ends this day

Friday Mar the 6th commences with fresh breezes from the S and W
cloudy with squalls of rain took in the top of the sails
Lat 53.06 took in the top of the sails and made them again close
Lon 81.04 part fresh gales shorten sail to D.R. M.S. and fore sail
cloudy away the Westward made sail at 8 PM all sail set heading W.N.W.
Saw one ship at 1 PM so ends this day

Saturday Mar the 7th commences with fresh breeze and pleasant
cloudy weather heading from N to N.E. backed at 5 AM
heading to the S and W Middle part wind shifts to the West
Lat 52.55 word were ship heading to the North ward saw two sails
Lon 80.30 steering to the Southward a English barque, and a Swedish
brig exchanged signals and Longitudes, dubl reef

Sunday Mar the 8th commences with fresh gales the westward
S.W. and squally wind shifts to the S and W, were ship at 5 AM
Lat 50.00 Middle part fresh gales and squally short sail
Lon 80.00 later part the same so ends this day

Monday Mar the 9th commences with fresh gales from
the Westward were ship at 2 AM, heading to
the Northward wind shifts to the South by W
Lat 50.50 with heavy sea closed M.S. and fore sail, made
Lon 80.30 sail steering N.W. later part fresh gales
with squalls of hail saw a sail to seaward
at 2 PM, Dubl reef M.S. and fore sail at 6 PM M.S. & fore
squally at 10 PM shorter sail to D.R. fore sail

Tuesday Mar the 10th commences with fresh gales and
N.W. squalls of hail from the Westward took
in the fore and main sail at 6 AM with heavy sea
Lat 48.03 Middle part made sail pared a sail steering to
Lon 79.15 the South E. at 2 PM took the fore sail a shocking
N.W. went a reef later part all sail with a fresh breeze
from the S.W. saw a barque to seaward

Wednesday Mar the 11th commences with fresh gales from the
N.W. North and West with squalls saw a sail to seaward
Lat 48.13 all sail set Middle part took in the fore sail
Lon 78.31 a sail in sight of the lee quarter, wind shifts
to the Westward heading N by the wind
