Thursday the 12<sup>th</sup> commences with fresh breezes from the Westward and pleasant all night hidens at 11<sup>th</sup> N fresh breezes with squalls at 11<sup>th</sup> AM took in the top sail sails, later part wind light made the all sail at 6 PM so ends this day

Friday Mar the 13<sup>th</sup> commences with fine breezes coming from W to WNW Middle part wind hals to the Northward kep off at 5 PM for St Barlas having a Barque steering to the N and E so ends this day

Saturday Mar the 14<sup>th</sup> commences with fresh gales from the Northward Made the land at 2 AM, having N.E. at 5 saw the land on the lee bow at 6 AM reefed the top sails and held on the wind wore ship at 8 AM made sail at 6 PM run in to the Bay so ends this day

Sunday Mar the 15<sup>th</sup> commences with fresh Gale from the Northward and pleasant run in to the anchorage at 1 PM let go the larboard anchor and parted the chain then let go the other <sup>and so</sup> anchor hands employed in fishing for the anchors and working the hel to stop a leak the captain went on shore at 4 AM and came off at 6 AM later part dragged for the anchor but did not heech it so ends this day

Monday Mar the 16<sup>th</sup> in port captain went on shore at 1 PM come off at 6 AM 14 men run away in the evening board the starboard boat at 10 AM to look for them did not find them came on board and hoisted her up with breez from the N, later part rain capt went on shore so ends this day rainy 5 men run away Bought an inchor and recruited ship Shipped 6 men, left the American cap West of N B bound home the only American ship there 12 chily men there

Tuesday March the 1<sup>st</sup> said anchor and made sail at 12 PM course light breeze from the westward at 4 PM the land WNW bore North, on the larboard leese and SSW on the other Middle part fresh breeze from the southward set the M.S.S at 5 PM Steering WNW

Wednesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> commences with fine breezes from the southward and pleasant Middle part calm at 6 PM raised black fish and dour 2 boats the Land W boats struck some and brought them on board light breeze from the W.W. so ends this day

Thursday the 3<sup>rd</sup> commences with light winds from close by the N.W. picked ship at 8 AM fed ing Wyl Middle part light winds from S and W later part steep breeze doubled the top sails menced the sheber, put the bow Boat on her oarrows at 5 PM so ends this day

Friday the 4<sup>th</sup> commences with fine breezes from the N.W. with N.W. rain at 4 PM let go the M.S. at 2 PM wore ship Lat 56 17 vinyl held to the Westward and made sail Lat 56 58 Middle and later part fine breeze from the S and W steering S.W. all sail - hold the Mac kish made 2 barrels fitted eye cabins

Saturday the 5<sup>th</sup> commences with fresh breezes from the N.W. and W with pleasant weather Middle and later Lat 55 45 the same repaired sails and bent studing Lat 57 44 sails so ends this day

Sunday the 6<sup>th</sup> commences with light wind, and pleasant Middle calm light breeze from the Northward Lat 55 10 at 4 PM tacked ship at 6 PM heading to the Westward Lat 57 10 tacked ship at 10 PM heading to the S and E so ends this day

Monday the 7<sup>th</sup> commences with light winds from the Northward with hatched for Porpoise at 4 PM Lat 55 23 Middle part the same Later part both out the after hatch and coopers provisions saw a fin and granpises
