fitting boats and craft so ends this day

Friday the 9<sup>th</sup> light winds from the Northward  
... <sup>red</sup> island pleasant Middle and later parts light  
Lat 16, 15 S. baffling winds painted the stern boats  
no. d. so ends this day lacked ship at 10. <sup>red</sup> ending to the N.

Saturday the 10<sup>th</sup> light winds and calms light breeze  
N.W. from the south and east. Middle parts the same  
Lat 06, 59 S. later part lanch'd the stern Boat and hoist  
Lon 115, 21 W. her. up so ends this day

Sunday the 11<sup>th</sup> light winds and calms sound the  
S.W. S Boat for a grampus and swimming. Middle  
Lat 07, 52 S. part light breeze from the Northward later  
Lon 115, 21 W. part wind hails to the South E. set the St. Topmast  
N.W. S Topmast and St. S. studing sails so ends this day

Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> fine breeze from the N.E. at 3 P.M. wind  
N.W. hails to the N.E. and hall down the studing sails  
Lat 08, 05 S. Middle part No alteration ~~to~~ whales to  
Lon 115, 22 W. windward at 12 past 9 P.M. ~~and~~ S. boats L.W. and  
Bow Boats But could not get up to them cold  
clay the Boats on board at half past 11 raised Black fish

Tuesday the 13<sup>th</sup> fine breeze from the N.E. East sound  
... for the Starboard Boat for the Black fish the  
Lat 08, 07 S. rest of the Boats bearing down the S.E. got fast  
Lon 115, 46 W. but drawed all the boats came on board at 12  
and braced forward and sent out the studing sails  
run this 24 hours N.E. trades all this rest of this day

Wednesday the 14<sup>th</sup> fine breeze from the N.E. and pleasant  
N.W. Middle the same later part got the potatoes  
Lat 12, 07 S. up and dried them and pick'd them over  
Lon 115, 27 W. so ends this day set the lower studing sail  
N.W. course

Friday the 16<sup>th</sup> fresh N.E. trades and pleasant Middle and  
Lat 14, 20 S. later part the same going 258 miles this 24 hours  
Lon 129, 16 W.

Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup> Fresh N.E. trades and pleasant  
Lat 15, 40 S. Middle and later parts the same. course W.S. W  
Lon 132, 13

Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup> Fresh N.E. trades and pleasant  
Lat 17, 09 S. Middle and later part the same set the St. Topmast  
Lon 135, 14 <sup>red</sup> in the Lowland course W.S. W

Monday the 19<sup>th</sup> Fine N.E. trades and Pleasant  
course W.S. set the lower studing sail Middle part light  
Lat 17, 38 S. baffling winds with squalls of rain later  
Lon 137, 26 S. part broke out the provisions and iron  
bound it so ends this day

Tuesday the 20<sup>th</sup> fine winds from the Northward  
Lat 18, 40 S. with cloudy weather cooping provisions  
Lon 140, 44 Middle part fine breeze and pleasant later  
W.S. W part same as the first in work

Wednesday the 21<sup>st</sup> fine winds from the N.E. East  
Lat 19, 54 S. and pleasant cooping provisions  
Lon 143, 43 Middle part fine breeze and pleasant  
W.S. W later part the same

Thursday the 22<sup>d</sup> fine N.E. trades and pleasant  
W.S. W set the lower studing sail Middle part the same with  
Lat 20, 30 S. squalls of rain later part the same  
Lon 146, 41 so ends these 24 hours

Friday the 23<sup>d</sup> fine N.E. trades with squalls of rain  
Lat 20, 47 S. Middle and later part the same course W.S. W  
Lon 148, 16 fitted mowing tubs

Saturday the 24<sup>th</sup> Fine East by winds and pleasant
