Lat 35, 55.4 Steering N.W. going 8 knots by log Middle and
Long 178, 53.8 Later part the same sounds this day crossed the Meridian
N.W. 3.8

Wednesday the 11th Fresh winds from the N.E. and
N.W. cloudy saw several schools of Porpoises filled
Lat 38, 06 a platform before the works Middle and later
Long 177, 24.8 parts fresh wind and hazy Steering the N.W. sail

Thursday the 12th Fresh winds from the Eastward and
N.W. hazy saw a finback. Middle part stiff breeze out
Lat 41, 50. cloudy the sails turned up with sea throat.
Lon 176, 06. Later part stiff breeze coming to the East
saw several finbacks sounds this day

Friday the 13th Fresh wind from the Eastward and
N.W. hazy saw a school of Killars held up the N.
Lat 44, 10 sail and kept far from then luffed to
Lon 174, 54 N.W. and held down the Main tack Middle and
N.W. Later parts stiff breeze and hazy sounds this day

Saturday the 14th Fresh wind from the Eastward and
N.W. hazy saw finbacks a plenty fired the fore top sail
Lat 46, 06 and firing got thick fog Middle and later parts
Lon 174, 21 the same wind came to the southward

Sunday the 15th Fine breeze from the southward with
N.W. thick fog furled the Main sail at 12 PM
Lat 48, 28 and later raised the fore top sail Middle part
thick fog and light wind saw a ship at 8 PM
later the wind and fire at again sounds this day

Monday the 16th commences with wind to the southward
and foggy spoke the ship to windward than morning
Lat 50, 00 the doctor come on board to see the doctor. Duble reefed
the fore top sail Middle part light breeze and thick
fog. Later reefed the Main top sail and furled the Main
sail. Saw a Right Whale at 9.30 the first
Middle and later parts wind to the N.E. course N.W.

Long 173, 15 raised whales at 4 in the morning bound a harbor
boats could not get fast came on board and
saw in sight whales at 10, bound a harbor boats could not get fast
this day ends with the boats down

Lat 50, 27 Boat struck at 12 and run to the windward
Lon 172, 57 till 3 AM and cut after using up all the craft the
had came on board at 3 PM Middle part calm then
sail to the fore sails on the caps and set quarter
patches made sail at 4 PM saw nothing but said
about the 3 boats

Saturday the 21st light winds from the South saw
N.W. nothing but finbacks and hump backs
steering N.W. Shorten sail at 10 PM
Phenomenon of the water, saw a finback at 8 PM.
Lat 51, 27 later part hazy & ends this day this ends the end
Lon 170, 12 account raised whales at 4 PM bound all the boats
and the Larber Boat got fast and cut for the fog
saw seven whales came on board for light up bound
the Bow and Waist boats could not get fast
later part light winds and thick fog steering
by the wind bore ship at 12 heading to the S.W.
