

Bark Warsaw Cruising off

Saturday July the 26th strong winds from the S.W. saw
land 2 ships and 1 whale later part moderates and
Lat 54 55 sail at 9 AM signa light in ship showing a blue
long toward white signal with L in it. Shorter sail
at 8 PM

Sunday the 27th Light winds from the southward spoke
Lat 55 04 the Levant of Sag Harbor Capt. Havens 10 mi out
Lon 162 00 2 whales on bear saw several ships and 1 bark saw
no whales this day Land in sight

Monday the 28th Light winds and calm saw a right whale
at 8 PM lowered the larboard boat did not see him
Lat 55 00 again 12 ships in sight this morning thick fog
longer with rain at 9 AM later part fresh breeze from
the southward spoke the Mains of 18 1/2 mi out
1000 lb. lowered the larboard boat and shot some seal at 10 AM
shorter sail at 4 PM Land in sight this morning

Tuesday the 29th Light winds and calms from the S.W. 10 ships
in sight wind blew to the southward stood in for the
Lat 55 10 land saw several humpbacks Mount Cronica bearing
Lon 162 25 W Land about 20 miles of shorter sail at 8 1/2 PM
wore ship at 10 PM landing of shore

Wednesday the 30th Light winds from the southward wore
ship at 1 PM heading in for the land stood in till
Lat 54 19 9 AM harked ship and stood off land 5 miles off 2 ships
Lon 160 35 to seaward and wore to windward spoke her the Steady
of S. H. capt. Wild 8 mi out ⁵⁰⁰ sperm 20 whale 2 whale
on bear made 400,000 in all, dilled reefed the top sails
at 12 Merid thick fog lights up at 5 AM saw a right whale
to thick to lower harked ship at 10 AM heading off 11 1/2 mi W

Thursday the 31st Light winds from the southward and clear
saw 3 ships this morning lowered the Lar and
boats for 2 humpbacks could not get on at 11 AM
thick fog spoke the Ballance, Sled of Providence
blame out 600 lb. harked a ship to windward firing
cuped at the Morisera of S. L.

Friday August 1st commences with strong winds from the S.W. thick
and fog working to windward spoke the Mains
capt. Briggs of Sag Harbor 5 whales at 1 PM, middle part
lights up saw several sails and 1 whale at 6 PM spoke
the Bark Kanawatha 4 whales a seal saw 2 ships to seaward

Saturday the 2nd commences with light southerly winds and squalls
of rain at 6 PM lights up saw several sail and 2 finbacks
Middle part light breeze and thick fog shorter sail
at 6 PM broke out the top sheet so ends

Sunday the 3rd Light winds from the southward with calms blowing
S.W. wind haled to the southward at 4 AM with
Lat 55 35 N thick fog lights up at 10 PM 2 ships in sight
Lon 162 25 W saw several humpbacks later part wind baffling
heading to the westward

Monday the 4th Light winds from the S.W. and pleasant breeze
all 4 boats at 9 AM for humpbacks the Larboard Boat
Lat 55 16 struck at 11 AM and held on till 2 PM then returned
Lon 161 50 got up to bear while past spoke a carmine colored
the opposite of land bearing 15 mi out 800 later part
light winds and calms heading to the S.W.

Tuesday the 5th First part light winds from the southward and
calm 8 ships in sight all heading in for the land
Lat 52 35 lowered the L and Sea Boats again at 10 later part
Lon 160 50 Light breeze from the S.E. shot a seal at 2 PM lower
the Lar Boat but could not catch him Nothing in
sight but humpbacks and plenty of them

Wednesday the 6th Strong E. S. winds and rain wore ship at 3
Lat 52 58 D.M. sailing S.E. furled the fore sail at 6 AM later
Lon 158 55 part light winds and heavy sea with fog
by the land 18 1/2

Thursday the 7th Light southerly winds and pleasant squalls
in to the westward made the land at 4 AM
Lat 52 36 saw a Cronak ship standing to the Northward stood
Lon 162 51 in till 12 Meridian saw 2 humpbacks and 1
by the land ed ship heading of shore later part strong
winds dilled reefed the top sails at 1 PM thick
fog at 3 PM shorter sail 15 miles of the
land at 11
