Clear. Madesail at 4 AM land in sight stood off
Lat 51 30 Shore saw several humpbacks and 1 sail in shore
Long 160 17 lashed ship at 12 heading in shore saw 1 finback
at 5 PM shot at him struck a leg and lost him
in a school of killers at 6 PM lashed of shore at 7 PM

Sunday the 10th Fresh South westerly winds with thick fog till in
Lat 51 25 the 13 sail and bore sail at 12 Meridian saw nothing
Long 160 57 heading to the south and East all this day

Monday the 11th First part light winds from the south
Lat 51 38 and west wore ship at 4 AM heading to the N West
Long 160 44 thick fog till 10 AM lights up and clear all the
rest have not seen a spout of a whale this day

Tuesday the 12th First part light winds from the S W and breeze
Spoke Jacques Lafitt of Thave, capt. Parker 9 whales
Lat 51 33 8 mo out Middle part saw nothing later part saw
Long 160 59 plenty of hump backs raised a stick by windward
by red & downed the Lar and Star boats and pulled up there and found
to be a shales tongue took in sail at 8 PM heading to the

Wednesday the 13th Light winds from the South westward
Lat 51 00 and thick fog all this day working to windward
Long no saw several finbacks fog so thick can not see 2 ships

Thursday the 14th First part light winds and calms made sail
Lat 51 45 at 4 AM heading to the land west thick fog all this
Long 162 27 day wind back to the eastward ship steering
to the South saw nothing lashed on the wind also

Friday the 15th Light winds from the land East and thick fog wore
Ship at 8 AM heading to the eastward saw nothing Middle
part saw Light up at 6 PM saw the land to the
land West about 4 miles off saw the water worn the

the L had 1600 the M had 1200, heaved from the

Wednesday the 20th Light winds from the South and west
Lat 54 00 run off to the N and west land in sight at 6 AM
Long 162 20 raised a gun of sight whales at the 1 1/2 hour

and drew lowered the Bow and Waist Boats and
Spoke the Stars, chased could not get fast, saw shales several
on off 1/2 part times this day lowered the Lar Boat & Waist &
Nickeron, took saw 4 Starboard, 3 times. Later part thick and heavy
shorten sail at 5 PM in a thick fog ungodly time

Thursday the 21th Light southerly winds and
worked in with the Lar saw several ships
Lat 54 31 and humpbacks a plenty. 2 PM raised a right
shale lowered 3 boats the Lar Waist and Star Boat
the Waist Boat struck and the shale running
with her, cut and came on board at 6 PM took
in sail heading off shore toward the Northward
