Friday August the 22nd First part...
and hazy standing in for the land saw a sloop
rigged forel steering to the southward shorten sail
at 10 AM, saw two ships to windward later part
wind moderates, made sail and steered South
saw several humpbacks and finbacks no right whales
shorten sail at 6 PM, mount Kronosky bearing West

Saturday the 23rd Light northerly winds and pleasant
Lat 54.16 standing to the Westward saw one right whale
Long 162.10 and humpbacks without number in a
loured the ship to leeward at 6 AM, mount Kronosky
W Boat for a bearing W, N, W, spoke the Bark Neularyport
humpback Capt Gray of Stoneington 13 mo, cut 12,000 whale
carvel all hand worked off shore. 2 ships in sight

Sunday the 24th First part stiff breeze from the Northward
and cloudy 3 ships in sight this morning hump
backs in sight all this day no right whale
later part light winds at 6 PM 6 ships in sight
beding off shore, called some the main flour of 15.
steering to the NE, under full 8 Topsails

Monday the 25th Fresh North Westerly winds saw a ship
at 3 AM, under 2 or 3 topsails, squally took in the
main sail and 1st, haled aback at 4 AM for the
ship a stern then ran up her bows and cut up
a few quinquans then stood to the NW, saw
a ship to leeward took in the 4th at 11 AM made
the land at 6 PM and wore ship beding East

Tuesday the 26th Fresh Northerly winds and foggy saw several
humpbacks set the fore topsail and stood in
Lat 55.47 shore later part thick fog stood of shore at 5 PM, saw
shorten sail at 6 PM, beding in about NW, N, of 15th

Wednesday the 27th Fresh Northerly winds and foggy stood in
to the Westward raised right whales at 3 PM loured
Lat 55.50 the 3 larbord boats could not get fast, came on board
and saw whales at 6 PM loured the 3 larbord boats
but with no better success,

Thursday August the 28th Strong northerly winds and hazy saw several
finbacks this morning beding in for the land
Lat 55.24 made it off Polasky at 10 AM spoke a English Bark
Lat 61.15 a boiling and a French ship a whaling loured
at 4 PM for a galled whale could not get up to him
saw ship of shore at 6 AM Cape Polasky bearing
West about 15 or 20 miles off later part calm beding

Friday the 29th Commences with light winds from the South
and East, a not foggy at 6 AM beding to the North and
Lat 55.20 Eastward at 8 AM commenced filling water in the bow
hole for ballast raised whales at 9 AM loured the lar
and waist boats, thais going quick could not fasten
3 ships in. loured the bow and Starbord boats, but in thick fog
sight all boats about 2 miles from the ship, a French ship being
whaling, went in sight the Larbord Star boats went on board of her
got onny thing light up, again raised the ship and went on board
the other boats got on board about the same time raised
whales at 1 PM, the Captain and Mate had some
hard talk and steaced in putting the Mate, for
the Frenchs Steerum, of duty they had, a click and the capt
ships name said off beding, I was not put in irons he would
was the blow the ship up, then he sent 3 or 4 blow and
Lincourt there was no more said, loured at 2 PM, 3 boats the
Bow, Waist and Starbord, shut in foggy and came
on board and finished filling water, saw several
finbacks, took in sail at 4 PM, loured about 10 miles

Saturday the 30th Commences with light breeze from
the Northward and foggy, raised right whales
Lat 55.19 at 5 AM loured the 3 boats the Star, Waist and Bow
the Bow Boat struck and the Starbord Boat
kild him then chased some then took the whale
along side at 9 AM and commenced cutting fin
at 11 AM, made sail and loured for whales that pro
ed to be finbacks came on board and set the watch
2 ships in sight the land about 20 miles off

Sunday the 31st Light variable winds and pleasant loured
Lat 55.23 for whales, forced to be humpbacks at 5 AM saw a right
whale at 8 AM, galled loured for right whale at 2 PM
did not fasten, came on board and loured again
all this day a contrary loured the S. S. 2 1/2 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31
