

12 Bark Warsaw of St. Petersburg. Bruno

Friday September the 12<sup>th</sup> first thick fog and very late part  
Lat 52.35 lights up. saw 10 ships the land about 15 miles off  
no whales in sight. Cutunarskoi bearing N 20 miles

Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup> light winds from the southward and calm  
steering to the northward 12 ships in sight and a  
Lat 52.26 plenty of finbacks no right whales in sight this day  
Long 160.50 spoke the "Mancos" of Hamburg 6 whales and the "Mancos"  
Capt. Drake 12 m out 6 whales. saw a carcass

Sunday the 14<sup>th</sup> light winds from the north and East  
and cloudy 11 ships in sight this morning  
plenty of humpbacks and finbacks no right  
whales at 6 PM the point bore N 8 E 2 miles  
working to the N 8, saw a carcass this morning

Monday the 15<sup>th</sup> first part calm raised right whale at 12 m  
lenced the "Mancos" and Star boats could not get up to him  
Lat 52.51 saw whales several times lenced 2 all 3 boats whale  
Long 160.50 going quick could not get on saw the "Mancos"  
boats chasing whales. Capt. Cutunarskoi bearing N 20  
later part light breeze from the S 2 ships in sight  
steering to the N 8 with a 4 m not large

Tuesday the 16<sup>th</sup> light winds from the S 2 and pleasant  
Cutunarskoi bearing N 20 miles thick fog  
from 6 till 8 AM, raised whales a breaching at 9 AM  
lenced 3 boats could not fasten lenced a gain at  
Lat 53.14 11 AM, with no better success stood in shore and  
went in shore after wood saw nothing special  
came on board at 7 PM discharged the wood and stood  
off to the eastward saw plenty of humpbacks in  
shore 1 ship in sight to windward  
at 9 PM Cutunarskoi Point bearing S 2  
Dis 12 miles from which we take our departure

Wednesday the 17<sup>th</sup> fine breeze from the S 2 and pleasant  
steering E 4 S saw several finbacks, lost sight  
of the Mountains at 12 meridian cleared up  
Lat 52.40 the decks and commenced to scrape them so  
Long 162.35 saw watches at 4 PM. Steward sent forward and  
Anderson took his place. Sailed the last dog so ends

Over to the N American side Capt. Barnum 1845  
Thursday September the 18<sup>th</sup> light winds from the westward and pleasant  
Lat 52.16 saw several finbacks this morning, raised a right  
Long 166.52 whale at 1 PM lenced at 2 PM 3 boats but with no  
better success than usual course E 4 S

Friday the 19<sup>th</sup> strong southerly winds and cloudy saw several  
Lat 52.25 finbacks and humpbacks: sharp winged birds very  
Long 167.29 plenty: with appearance of whale fin course E 4 S  
took in the "Mancos" and "Ed" line caps to westward  
overhauled the Star pump from a hole in it

Saturday the 20<sup>th</sup> first part light southerly winds and strong  
Middle part strong wind set the "Mancos" at 11 PM  
Lat 52.18 Dull, ruffled the topsails at 2 PM and furled the main  
Long 172.22 spoke the "Soloncha" of N 8, 4 whales this season  
course E 4 S, 8 PM course E 4 S

Sunday the 21<sup>st</sup> strong southerly winds and cloudy with squalls  
of rain. Made sail at 10 AM at 12 meridian held up  
Lat 51.44 N 8, saw at 2 PM a reef of breakers extending E and W  
Long 176.30 for several miles. Lat 51.50 Long 176.50. Dropped off E 4 S  
and shorten sail at 6 PM. No land in sight saw  
plenty of seal and calf. breakers not laid down  
on the chart. very dangerous in the night  
kept of E 4 S under short sail at 8 PM

Monday the 22<sup>nd</sup> light southerly winds and pleasant  
held up N 8 at 12 meridian made the land  
Lat 51.22 at 4 PM 2 miles off sent the "Mancos" and Star boats  
Long 179.40 in to sea if there was any clapnet there  
came off at 7 PM saw nothing but seal  
and open the bow boat shot a seal and  
brought him off. saw a great many on the  
rocks, stood off shore heading south all sail  
took a Lazar this morning. This is the island  
of Amalaka

Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup> light Easterly winds and cloudy at  
moderate S 2. the land about 4 miles off the bow and  
this day. "Mancos" boat sent in on an exploring expedition  
came off at 3 PM. shot 2 ducks and several  
other fowl saw nothing remarkable but the house  
of some one. at 6 PM. lenced D. the topsails and  
shorten sail at 8 PM. Steered and
