

Bark Warsaw of Stonington from Omlatka
Wednesday September 24th commenced with strong E. & S. easterly
winds and pleasant at 10 A.M. shot topsails on.
Lat 50.26.8 no mast heads therefore we saw nothing for
Long 179.45 the barrel of paint oil was in the hold and
lost 1/3 of it later part pleasant saw the
land to windward course East

Thursday the 25th strong N. & N. W. winds and squalls nothing
Lat 49.37.0 in sight to day. set the M. S. at 4 P.M. wind
Long 177.58. Hails yesterday heavy but sea. Cooper and 2 men
sick spends this day course S. E. & E.

Friday the 26th fine breeze from the N. W. with squalls of
hail mended the fore sail course S. E. & E.
Lat 49.43 all sail out that will draw going 6 knots
Long 176.54 Cooper got on deck again and went man &

Saturday the 27th Light breeze from the westward and pleasant
Lat 50.16.8 all sail set. Steaming S. E. & E. saw several
Long 170.55.4 finbacks broke out stores some papers very dull

Sunday the 28th Light breeze from the westward and pleasant
Lat 50.22. the most of the time plenty of finbacks in sight
Long 167.58 course S. E. & E. till 2 P.M. then E. S. E. so ends Friday

Monday the 29th Fresh breeze from the Southward and cloudy
Lat 50.26 close by the wind heading N. E. saw nothing later
Long 164.52 Part of the breeze at 6 P.M. dulle raked the topsails
and furl'd the M. S. E. so ends this day

Tuesday the 30th First part fresh Easterly winds and
Lat 51.45 squally heading S. E. till 12 M. at 1 P.M. wore ship
Long 162.16 and furl'd the M. S. E. and set heading S. E.

Wednesday October the 1st Strong Easterly winds and foggy
heading to the S. E. all day no observations so ends
furl'd the fore topsail at 4 P.M. so ends this day

Thursday the 2nd Strong winds from the East and
round to the N. W. close raked the M. S. topsail at
2 P.M. set the M. S. topsail tacked and turned a reef
out of the M. S. very heavy swell took in the Main Boat
at 6 P.M.

Friday October the 3rd Strong gales from the westward and squally
heading under 50 topsails and foresail heading E. S. E.
Lat 50.48 at 4 P.M. wind half to the S. E. took in the M. S. sail
Long 157.07 at 8 P.M. wind half to the S. W. at 10 P.M. set the
M. S. sail and set at 2 P.M. set the Main sail

Saturday the 4th Commences with light southerly winds and thick
fog heading East under short topsails. no observation

Sunday the 5th Light westerly winds and cloudy steering E. S. E.
no observation all sail out that will draw so ends this day
Lat 48.48 Long 152.54. 9 A.

Monday the 6th Light westerly winds and cloudy steering E. S. E.
sent the fore & Gallant sail and M. S. topsail mended
Lat 47.57 the waist boat when she was stove by the crane and
Long 148.00 made a new davie for her that was broke set up
the force and several other things to mend and mended
from no observations to day saw nothing so ends

Tuesday the 7th Light southerly winds and cloudy heading
Lat 47.18 from E. S. E. to E. S. E. all sail set put the waist
Long 147.44 boat on her cranes later part furl'd a part
and several other jobs to mend and mended
took in the M. S. and M. S. at 6 P.M. so ends this day

Wednesday the 8th Light winds from the S. E. and pleasant
Lat 47.18 heading East saw several finbacks mended
Long 144.55 many chest and several other jobs taken in the M. S. at 6 P.M.

Thursday the 9th Light southerly winds and pleasant
Lat 47.16 under wheel topsails heading E. S. E. saw
Long 142.05 seven finbacks so ends this day

Friday the 10th Light variable winds from the South and
Lat 47.00 East and pleasant tacked ship at 12 M. mended
Long 140.31 heading south under wheel topsails

Saturday the 11th Light variable winds the S. and E.
Lat 46.28 heading to the Eastward all sail set at 6 A.M.
Long 140.25 later part picked over the potatoes steering
E. S. E. at 8 P.M. struck a porpoise and lost him
