Friday the 17th light breezes from the Eastward and

Long 124.14 and started it down in the hold and cleared
Lat 46.28 out. saw nothing but porpoises today

raised blackfish at 9 A.M. lowered all 4 boats the
"Hart" boat got 2 the Lar. B. got 4 and the bow boat
Lat 46.28 struck and lost a shot of line all the had the Star
Long 124.14 B. struck and drew came on board at 12 and lower

Tuesday the 21st light south Easterly winds and pleasant
headed ship at 4 P.M. heading to the N. E. raised the
Lat 46.24 land at 10 P.M. on the lee bow stood in all day
Long 124.48 saw several fin backs, land at 4 P.M. 28 miles
of by chronometer sacked ship at 12 P.M. heading S. W.

Wednesday the 22nd light S. Easterly winds and calm fore
part thick fog heading S. W. saw several sunfish
Lat 46.14 lowered the 3 boat could not fasten nothing smaller
Long 125.24 the 16.48 out. more swimming than anything else

Thursday the 23rd strong S. Easterly winds and cloudy all this
Lat 46.45 day under school topsails saw nothing sacked
Long 126.02 ship at 4 P.M. heading E. N. E.

Friday the 24th Strong S. Easterly winds and pleasant
made the land at 10 A.M. at 2 P.M. 2 a the topsails
and stood in till 4 P.M. the land about 6 miles
off sacked ship heading S. W. E. no observations
saw several fires a shore and plenty of trees

Saturday the 25th wind the same as yesterday turned the
Lat 46.48 reefs out of the topsails at 3 P.M. wore ship at
Long 126.27 10 A.M. heading N. E. E. at 4 P.M. took in the main
sail and wore ship heading S. W. at 8 P.M. took
in the fore topsail and got berry heavy squalls of rain

Sunday the 26th commences with very heavy squalls of wind
and rain held up the fore sail at 2 P.M. at 4 P.M.
Lat 46.26 moderates wore ship heading E. S. E. and made sail
Long 126.28 as the wind goes down at 4 P.M. steering S. E. E. with
wind a bout west and very moderate with a heavy swell

Monday the 27th Light winds and calm at 8 P.M. a heavy
Lat 46.13 equal of rain with foggy wind calm till 6 P.M. light
Long 125.08 breeze from the E. commences S. E. E. fixed a 16 lb. ball at 10 P.M.
saw the land at 10 P.M.
