

Ship Warren Long in the port of St Francisco.
Sunday the 30th of November pleasant
the 1st 2nd 3rd 4th 5th 6th 7th 8th nothing special buying recruits
Monday the 1st of December pleasant the Captain
went to town and discharged Wm. Gordon
at 6 PM Mr. S. went to a Standango to Mrs
Reeds. I fell across the coming of the Whatch
and hurt myself. Nothing else special
Tripp and friends

Tuesday the 2nd of December pleasant Capt. and Lieut. went to the
Cotters and came back at 6 PM Mr. S. went to town
at 4 PM, heard that 3 of the men that runaway from the
mored is killed by the Indians

Wednesday the 3rd of December pleasant Making a few
preparations for sea so ends this day

Thursday the 4th of December calm all this day finis
hed getting our recruits &c

Friday the 5th of December pleasant at 6 PM held out
to a bark more preferable to get under
way at 10 PM the Charles Phelps went out
at 2 PM we hoisted up and stood out in
two three channel and found the wind
a head, and stood back and come to an
anchor at 4 PM

Saturday the 6th of December calm all the fore part
at 4 PM hoisted up and stood out under
all sail with a light breeze from SE
at 6 PM foggy hearing 6 PM, heard 8 PM
thick fog all night raining down the Land

Sailed from St Francisco the 14th after Laine here
48 days getting our recruits consisting of 1st class
bumpkins vicious hogs &c. had plenty of shooting
while there for and, best in a hundred while there
there we had 4 men runaway discharged 3 and shipped 2
24 men and 1 woman onboard at present

1845 Ship Warren Bound southward Capt. S. Barnum
Sunday Dec the 1st Light variable winds from the Land West
saw a ship a head at 5 PM, at 10 came up
with her proved to be the Capt. Phelps the Capt.
came onboard and stayed shore, at 2 PM
she was hull down astern took on all sail
but the G and M topsails, to keep company,
saw several humpbacks to day the land about
10 miles off ear

Monday the 2nd fine breeze from the SW and pleasant the
the Phelps in sight a stern at 12 Meridian
Lat 36, 28, 30, 32 the topsails down on the caps at 6 PM
Long 121, 52 Tabled the topsails the Phelps about 10 miles
astern. saw several humpbacks, and 100 miles
the land about 8 miles off steering from 10 PM

Tuesday the 3rd Light winds and calm with a heavy swell
sailing in shore made sail at 8 AM the S. Phelps
Lat 35, 21 about 1 mile off the Land at 6 PM rounded
Long and got 50 fathoms the Land about 4 miles
off Wind variable a head 10 miles off steering
E by S with a light breeze, carpenter fixing a key

Wednesday the 4th fore part light winds from the northward
and calm saw plenty of humpbacks and finbacks
Lat 34, 24 lowered the waist boat for work at 11 AM at 12 Meridian
sent the waist and bow boats in to Ross island
once 10 PM to see if was any elephant there, at 6 PM up with
the island San Francisco on our Star hand and Ross
on our Star hand the S. Phelps in sight astern
finished the day and set it up at 11 PM the
boats came onboard and reported nothing

Thursday the 5th Light variable winds and pleasant
at 9 PM the boats went on shore again in
company with the Phelps boats, layed off
one on all day the boats came off at 7 PM, saw
no elephant. brought several geese and plenty
of shells. Shorten sail at 8 PM and kept off 50
