

Remarks onboard the Bark Warsaw of New York
Friday the 20th of Dec. commences with light variable winds
and calm at 5 P.M. the island of St. Barbara seen
Lat 33.27 N 88.2 E dis 6 miles the boats in company with the
Phelps boats sent on a survey that 24 hours
ends having off and on for the boats

Saturday the 21st light variable winds and calm at
5 P.M. the boats came off. saw nothing remarkable
Lat 33.15 at 10 P.M. shaped our course for St. Diego which
is 8 P.M. at 1 P.M. let the topsails run run
down to keep company with the Phelps
Capt. C. came onboard to supper at 4 hours 10 mins

Sunday the 22nd combs with light variable winds and
pleasant fast between the Islands of
St. Clementine and St. Catalina at 11 P.M. was
on the tops at 10 P.M. let the topsails run run
at 6 P.M. the Phelps 10 miles astern with steady
steering sails out so ends this day

Monday the 23rd combs with light variable winds
later part wind shifts to the S.W. steering
Lat 32.55 E. A. spoke the Phelps at 6 P.M. then made
Sunderall sail and stood in to Point Loma
and came to an anchor in 8 fathoms of water
at 8 1/2 P.M. furled the sails and set the watch

Tuesday the 24th commences with light winds and
calm at 6 A.M. lowered the bow boat to catch fish
at 11 P.M. hoisted and stood in for the harbor
at 1 P.M. calm lowered the bow and Lar. and waist
boats to tow. run a kedge and went on beam
to furl the sails. the Captain and Mr. Durfee
had some words and it ended in his being
put off duty. raised the kedge and made sail
steering S.W. in company with the Phelps

Wednesday the 25th fine S.W. westerly winds and cloudy
Lat 31.16 at 2 A.M. hoisted a back for the Phelps at 3 1/2 P.M. left off
steering S.W. carried sail sufficient to keep along
with our consort

at the Beres Islands and Borneo Southward
Thursday the 26th combs with strong westerly winds and pleasant
at 5 A.M. made the Island of Sausaloup and run
Lat 29.01 S down the East side of it the Phelps going down.
Long 117.47 the westward saw nothing saw the Phelps again at 5 P.M.
Laid off and on all night & kept Christmas etc

Friday the 26th combs with light winds and calms at 5 A.M. the
Lar and Waist Boats went onshore the Lar
Lat 28.41 about 15 miles off found the Phelps boats
Long 117.32 there saw nothing but the remains of some
houses where some, some had been there after
goats and elephant came off at 5 P.M. Capt
Penelton came onboard to supper then he
off to with a light breeze

Saturday the 27th combs with fine breeze from the northward
and pleasant steering E at 5 P.M. Capt. C. came
Lat 28.16 onboard and got supper Mr. Durfee went onboard
Long 116.18 the Phelps: watches employed in picking wood
killed a pig etc so ends this day have a look
steering to the Westward at 11 P.M.

Sunday the 28th combs with light westerly winds
and pleasant at 5 P.M. wore ship and
Lat made all sail at 8 A.M. made the island of
Long Boenito and came up with it at 2 P.M. sent
in shore for examination found the Phelps
Boats there. got a plenty of shells the Phelps sent
got a fur seal saw no elephant but plenty of
bones of them

Monday the 29th combs with light winds and calm
stood off and on till 6 P.M. then stood over
Lat 28.24 to the Beres Island Capt. Pearce onboard at
Long 114.51 and sent in 2 boats to see if there was any
anchorage run down to the S.E. part of the
Island and came to an anchor in 15 fathoms
of water at 5 P.M. the Phelps came to at the
same time. Mr. Durfee came onboard and carried
his chest onboard of the Phelps by mutual consent
Latter part of this day full sea
