

Bark Warsaw off Gloucester cruising
Tuesday Jan the 30th Breeze with light westerly winds and pleasant
at 8 AM 2 boats in company with the Phelps
Boats started to go round the island.

Wednesday the 31st Breeze with light winds and pleasant
the Boats returned at 6 PM and saw a few
Elephant. the Capt and wife went a shelling.

Thursday Jan the 1st light winds and pleasant went
a fishing and a shelling so ends this day.

Friday the 2^d light winds and calm at 8 AM hove
up the anchor and stood down to the east
side of the Island and came too at 6 PM in
7 fathoms of water in company with the
Chs Phelps, high tide to day.

Saturday the 3^d Breeze with light westerly winds and calm
Lat 27.55 some went a shelling and some went a fishing
Long 115.15 the rest employed in ships duty so ends this day.

Sunday the 4th Breeze with light westerly winds
and calm at 11 PM hove up and stood out
to the eastward and the Chs Phelps the same
at 4 PM stood in towards the land and let
go the dredge in 20 fathoms of water and fished
at 8 AM hove up the dredge and made sail
the Chs Phelps standing to the N.E. high tide.

Monday the 5th Breeze with fine breeze from the N.E. and
Lat 27.24 and pleasant at 6 PM hove up to the land East
Long 114.30 and made sail. run down the land watches
employed in ships duty showing the anchor.

Tuesday the 6th Breeze with light N.W. winds and
Lat 26.44 pleasant starting E.S.E. with all sail so that
Long 112.44 will draw. the watches employed in peeling wood
for tanning and other necessary jobs so ends this day.

Wednesday the 7th Breeze with light breeze from the N.E. and calm
Lat 25.06 heading to the S.E. the land in sight. the watches
Long 112.35 employed as yesterday. the Carpenter fitting a turning lathe

down the East of California. Capt. S. Barnum 1846
Thursday Jan the 8th Breeze with light variable winds and pleasant
and ends the same. watches employed in peeling
Lat 24.18 and sawing wood the Carpenter and Blacksmith
Long 111.48 fitting a turning lathe the Course S.E. the Margaretta
Islands on our Lar Beam 10 miles off at 6 PM.

Friday the 9th Breeze with light variable winds and calm
Lat 24.04 the Margaretta Islands on our Lar Beam 15 miles off
Long 111.17 saw a ship off shore standing to the S.E.
employment the same as yesterday. Course S.E.

Saturday the 10th Breeze with light winds from the N.W.
and calm at 8 PM spoke the above mentioned
Lat 23.28 ship and proved to be the Louisa. bound
Long 110.13 in to the Cape. the Land in sight all day
at 8 fine winds from S.W. Course E.S.E.

Sunday the 11th Breeze and ends with light variable winds
and calm the Louisa in sight to the S.W. by day
Lat 22.44 coaled this morning with a U.S. Frigate. at 6 PM
Long 108.54 Cape St Lucas bearing N. by W. 10 miles. saw a hump
back this morning. The Cape of Palmas in sight.

Monday the 12th Breeze with light winds and calm
Course S.E. at 6 PM saw several humpbacks. the Louisa
in sight and another ship a stern and the
Lat 22.31 Frigate a head at 12 noon raised black fish
Long 108.05 and lowered 3 boats could not get fast came on
board at 4 PM. caught a green turtle later
part light breeze from the N. Cape Palmas in
sight. the watches employed in ships duty.

Tuesday the 13th Breeze with strong westerly winds and
E.S. slowly. middle part light winds and calm
Lat 22.12 lowered for black fish. 2 bare to day but with
Long 107.42 no better success than yesterday. later part
the same as the middle.

Wednesday the 14th Breeze with fine breeze from the
N.E. at 6 AM past the Island of San Juan and
run down by the Northernmost of the island
island and came to an anchor in the Bay
of the middle part in 12 fathoms of water at 6 PM
went around the point in the bay.
