

Bark Warsaw from the Islands bound
Friday the 27th up to Thursday the 5th in port several
ships arrived, shipped a boat and 4th made any
move up at 12 P.M. in company with the Nubaryport
Port and stood to the westward set the watches
had 37 men all told discharged 8 men here

Friday the 6th Light NE winds and pleasant fast
Waked at 12 Meridian and made 11 miles
lost sight of the Nubaryport at 5 P.M. saw
a ship to windward laid off and on all night

Saturday the 7th went on shore for recruits
Landed in company with the Nubaryport 12 boats
Long was at 5 P.M. the Capt and wives came off
and ran off to the westward between the Islands

Sunday the 8th light winds and calm came
with the Nubaryport the Islands in sight

Monday the 9th light winds and calm over course
Lat 22 14 in sight a stern. brook out the after hatch
and stowed the provisions the Capt through
the spyglass overboard etc

Tuesday the 10th Light winds with high tide under the weather
Long 1642 weather with a little course W Lat 22 15

Wednesday the 11th Pleasant mended the main sail
Long 16245 sail and bent the old main sail Lat 22 30

Thursday the 12th Pleasant mended the main sail
Lat 23 04 and employed in various ships duty
Long 16513

Friday the 13th Strong NE trades and Pleasant
Lat 23 40 Long 16727. Course W by S

Saturday the 14th Light winds and pleasant bent at
new Feb Lat 24 22 Lon 170 46. C. West

Sunday the 15th Light winds and Pleasant 24 37 175 21

to the whale around Capt J. B. Barqueum 18 45
Monday March the 16th Light Easterly winds and pleasant Lat 24 50
Long 174 30 with course W by S

Tuesday the 17th Light winds and pleasant bent the
Lat 24 46 old fore sail and repaired the new one set up
Long 175 37 some of the head rigging mended the G. 5 Stalls

Wednesday the 18th Light winds and pleasant wind
Lat 25 38 E S E watches employed in making spungam
Long 176 56 and various other ships duty Course W by S

Thursday the 19th Light winds from the Eastward and
Lat 26 24 pleasant employed in fitting boats S S
Long 178 15 have not seen any thing since our departure

Friday the 20th Light winds from the Eastward
Lat 27 08 saw a large quantity of luminous stone
Long 180 00 of which we caught some course S by W

Saturday the 21th Light winds from the SE and pleasant
Lat 28 12 at 12 half up N by E all this day the appearance
Long 185 50 of rain and a shift of wind employed in fitting rigging

Sunday the 22th Breeze with light Easterly winds and
Lat 28 58 pleasant at 7 P.M. wind shifts to the N by E at
Lon 188 24 P.M. under dull reef Topsails Breeze
Lat 28 58

Monday the 23th Breeze with light winds and rain
at 6 P.M. wind N E and cloudy under short
Topsails Course N W to observations

Tuesday the 24th Breeze with light breezes from
Lat 29 08 North East and pleasant under short
Lon 189 50 Topsails heading N by E like a burden for
the main hatch and rose a new 5th pul brace etc

Wednesday the 25th Breeze with light winds from the N
Lat 30 02 at 6 P.M. shifts to the N and W hatched ship
Lon 192 22 heading to the Northward Middle part square
double reefed the Topsails at 5 P.M. three
under dub reef N E sail and fore reef
heaving N by E through the topmast overboard
hook the weather out of the east end of the
