

Bark "Warsaw" Arriving on
Thursday March the 28th Breeze with strong winds from
Lat 52.25 the N.W. and squally at 11 A.M. took in the
Long 179.35 fore sail. Middle and later parts the same
as the first heading N.E. by N.

Friday the 28th Breeze with strong gales from the N.W.
Lat 52.19 and squally. Middle part the same
Long 179.35 fitted the fore & gallant back stay where it
was parted at 1 P.M. wore ship heading West
and set the fore sail.

Saturday the 28th Breeze with strong N.W. wind
Lat 52.10 at 4 A.M. more moderate made sail as the
Long 179.35 wind goes down on bent the main topsail
and mended it and sent it up again
heading N.W. by N. nor new N. by N. by E.

Sunday the 29th Light variable westerly winds and cloudy
Lat 51.56 heading to the Northward seen nothing
Long 177.16

Monday the 30th Light westerly winds and cloudy
Lat 52.14 on bent the main sail and repaired it
Long 175.22 course N.W. by W. all sail set shorten sail at 6.

Tuesday the 31st Breeze with strong westerly winds
Lat 55.50 and cloudy under pink reef topsails
Long 176.27 at 6 P.M. saw a finback took in the N. sail heading N.

Wednesday the 1st of April. Breeze with westerly winds
Lat 54.55 and pleasant at 12 Meridian backed ship
Long 177.21 heading N.W. by W. wore topsails saw several finback
backs and a large quantity of birds going &c.

Thursday the 2nd Breeze with light winds and calms at noon
Lat 54.50 lowered the Lar boat for a sword fish saw a ship to the
Long 176.35 westward at 4 P.M. raised a right whale and lowered
all 4 boats could not get on him the main
boat struck a turtle and raised course N.W. by W.

Friday the 3rd Breeze with strong S.E. wind and
Lat 54.50 squally run off to the N.W. till 3 P.M. wind
blew to the eastward and wore too under short
sail no deviation.

Whale Ground Capt J.S. Barnum 1845
Saturday April the 4th Breeze with strong westerly winds and
Lat 56.57 squally. heading to the N.W. by N. under dull
Long 175.59 reef topsails. Later part the same with hail.

Sunday the 5th strong gales from the westward with
Lat 58.60 heavy squally heading to the N.W. at 6 P.M.
Long 176.06 Dull ref. N.E. by S. and N.W. by S. saw a whale.

Monday the 6th strong westerly winds with squalls
Lat 58.34 of rain and hail heading to the Northward
Long 176.28

Tuesday the 7th more moderate on bent the main topsail.
Lat 59.16 and bent the fore topsail to the main sail
Long 177.22 later part wind light heading N.

Wednesday the 8th Light winds from the Northward backed
Lat 59.55 ship at 6 P.M. heading to the westward saw some
blows but did not find out what they were.
Long 177.05 on bent the fore & gallant sail and the Gaff topsail
took out the S. pump and fitted it &c.

Thursday the 9th Light Easterly winds and pleasant
Lat 40.40 starting N.W. by W. saw several finbacks ripped up
Long 175.24 a top sail and sent the fore topsail down and
repaired it sent it up again.

Friday the 10th Breeze with strong S.E. winds and cloudy
no other running off to the N.W. at 10 P.M. wind S.W.
to the westward took in sail and wore too heading
N. Later part squally with hail and snow.

Saturday the 11th Breeze with strong breezes from
Lat 48.6 the westward at 10. wore topsails at 11 P.M.
Long 174.00 reefed the wind S.W. to the southward
at 3 P.M. saw several whales. all 3. then right
wore too under short sail heading westward.

Sunday the 12th Breeze with strong S.E. wind and
no other and foggy no deviation heading westward.
