

Bark Warsaw Cruising on
Friday May the 1st Bore strong breeze from the westward.
Lat 44.5° attended with squalls of rain running to the East
Lon 163.55 at 6 shorted sail and have been riding South.

Saturday the 2^d Light westerly winds and cloudy broke
Lat 45.57 out the blubber room at 1 PM spoke the America
Capt. Good & month out with sperm got
a spy glass of him saw several finbacks.

Sunday the 3^d Bore with strong gales from the westward
at 1 PM close reef the 1st top sail heavy sea being
broad shipping some water with snow.

Monday the 4th Bore the same as above at 1 PM more
Lat 45.35 moderate sea ship to the N.W. very heavy
Lon 162.17 swell saw some finbacks nothing else spotted.

Tuesday the 5th Strong westerly winds and cloudy
Lat 46.07 double reef top sails heading to the northward
Lon 162.02 saw several finbacks and some birds.

Wednesday the 6th Bore with light S.W. winds and cloudy
at 6 AM short top sails tack ship and kept off
the N.W. saw several sperm blacks at 4 all sail
in but did not reef to sail and kept heading.

Thursday the 7th Light winds and calm with thick fog.

Friday the 8th Light winds and thick steering N.E. under
the 1st double reef top sails saw nothing nor like the

Saturday the 9th Light Easterly winds and pleasant first
Lat 45.25 part heading to the southward under all sail at
Lon 162.42 12 M. wind tacked to the N.W. heard repaired the fore
sail at 6 all hands shorten sail heading N.E. N.

Sunday the 10th Light winds from the S.W. East
at 5 AM made sail heading N.E. raining with fog
Lat 45.26 at 2 PM wind tacked to the S.W. on N.E. at 3 PM
shorten sail heading S.E. saw nothing.

Whale ground off Barrow on May 18th
Monday May the 11th Bore with strong westerly winds and cloudy
at 5 AM raised whales hove all 4 Boats at 9 AM
Lat 46.51 hove all 4 boats again for the same whale
Lon 171.33 at 11 hove the 3 Lar boats for a nother and
could not get fast heading to the north
saw later part strong winds at 6 shorted

Tuesday the 12th Bore with strong S.W. winds and cloudy run off
to the S.W. saw 3 humpbacks at 3 PM thick shorted
sail at 6 close reef the 1st top sail strong gale
and heavy sea at 8 PM more moderate.

Wednesday the 13th Bore with strong S.W. winds and squally
Lat 47.01 at 12 Meridian kept off East under double reef
Lon 173.42 top sails at 2 PM kept off N.W. at 6 shorted
sail and lay by heading N.W. on the Lar back.

Thursday the 14th Bore with strong westerly winds with
Lat 48.05 squalls of hail and snow heading to the N.W.
Lon 173.2 under double reef top sails and ends the same.
shorted sail at 7 PM saw nothing.

Friday the 15th Bore with fresh gales from the westward
Lat 48.04 at 2 PM tacked ship heading to the southward
Lon 174.22 saw nothing strong symptoms of going Eastward.

Saturday the 16th Bore with strong westerly winds and
Lat 48.47 cloudy heading to the southward at 1 PM kept
Lon 175.37 off 18.8. under double reef top sail saw nothing
on tent the fore sail to repair it.

Sunday the 17th Bore with strong westerly winds and
Lat 47.56 cloudy at day light as usual made sail
Lon 177.43 and kept off to the S.W. East at 1 PM made
the main 12 Salent sail and steered N.E. at 8
PM shorten sail heading N.W. saw nothing.

Monday the 18th Bore with light westerly and pleasant
Lat 48.19 and ends the same saw some whale spouts
Lon 179.44 saw a finback all sail set heading to the N.E.
East at 9 AM shorted the fore sail carried sail all
night with seawatches.
