

Bark ship Warsaw Cruising on
Friday June the 5th Comg with strong westerly gales
Lat 52° 00' and cloudy run off to the S.W. till 11 AM saw
Lon 168° 11' right whales and held on saw whales several
several times through the day

Saturday the 6th Comg with strong westerly winds and
cloudy heading to the S.W. at 8 AM wore ship
Lat 52° 05' to N.W. made whool topsails at 3 PM kept off
Lon 168° 00' S.E. and made all sail saw several hump
backs at 8 PM shorten sail heading northward

Sunday the 7th Comg with strong southerly winds
Lat 51° 57' with squalls of rain and snow spoke the
Lon. 168° 00' Mockeryama Tower of N.B. 23 miles out
2400. 8 whales this season, saw plenty
hump and fin backs on sent the N.B. 18
run off to the S and west short sail at 5 PM

Monday the 8th Comg with strong westerly winds
with squalls of hail at 3 PM pulled reef
Lat 51° 40' topsails saw several hump backs at 8 PM
Lon 168° 08' shorten sail heading N.W. the Mockeryama
in sight steering East

Tuesday the 9th Comg with strong westerly winds
with squalls of hail run off to the
Lat 51° 40' Easterly bent the N.B. 18 sail at 6 PM
Lon 166° 58' raised right whales shorten sail and
died off saw none ship

Wednesday the 10th Comg with westerly
Lat 52° 04' winds and cloudy cleared all 4 PM
Lon 165° 35' lines to day the N.B. struck and
drained wind sails to the southward
2 ships in sight to northward
Sent the new spanker

Thursday the 11th Calm all this day at 5 AM saw
10 right whale at 9 AM hauled the waist boat
Lat 52° 03' for guning at 1 PM hauled the Land and S.E. 2000
Lon 168° 52' for a right whale did not see him again hauled
the N.B. boat for guning and the bow and stern boats
for killers bent the fore sail

Whale ground Capt J. S. Barnum 1874
Friday June the 12th Comg with light breeze and calm lound
at 10 AM all the boats for humpbacks
Lat 51° 58' later part light Easterly winds run off
Lon 165° 40' to the N.W. spoke the Mockeryama got nothing
since the last report

Saturday the 13th Comg with strong Easterly winds
run off to the westward under short sail
Lat no op at 6 PM saw right whales and hove too
wore ship to the N.E. at 10 PM wore again to
the Southward at 6 PM so ends this day

Sunday 14 Strong Gale from the Eastward lying too
No Obs in sight thick and rainy

Monday 15th Strong Easterly winds and foggy
at 6 AM kept off S.W. under whool topsails
later part more moderate saw several hump
backs shorten sail at 8 and kept on her course

Tuesday the 16th Light southerly winds and pleasant
heading to the westward at 2 PM saw 2 right
whales going to windward spoke the ship
Jefferson of N.B. Capt Harris 2 seasons 1500
nothing this season from (Hannawatha)
shifted stward forward

Wednesday 17th Strong Easterly winds and thick fog
with rain heading S.W. under topsails later
part shorten sail saw nothing

Thursday 18th Comg with southerly winds and foggy
Lat 50° 08' at 7 AM kept off S.W. under whool topsails
Lon 173° 54' later part thick and rainy saw nothing

Friday 19th Comg with light northerly winds and foggy
heading to the N.W. and westward at 6 AM hauled
Lat 51° 55' the Land a head cald it Atcha Island hauled
Lon 174° 00' at 7 to the Eastward at 6 PM raised a sail
steering to the Westward shorten sail at 7
the Land in sight a storm
Chrimotioning fever raging very high
