

12 Bark Warsaw cruising on
Saturday June 20th Boms with light westerly winds with
no ch fog run off to the Eastward saw nothing

Sunday 21st Boms with westerly winds and cloudy run
no off to the Eastward saw a sail run all night

Monday 22nd Boms with strong westerly wind with fog
Lat 51.34.1. Squats at 4 PM raised right whale and
Lon 168.03.1. lowered all the boats with usual success plenty
of humpbacks in sight shorten sail at 8 PM
and lay by 4 right whales in sight today

Tuesday 23rd Boms with light westerly winds and
pleasant plenty of humpbacks in sight
Lat 52.09 at 1 PM spoke the American bark Kate
Lon 167.05 and got aboard saw the 22nd raised right whale
and lowered all the boats could not get hold
the Capt and Mr Lox had some words but
ended without serious difficulty. shorten sails

Wednesday 24th Boms with strong Easterly winds
and foggy spoke the American Brown N. 11 miles
no ch out of the side had a gun and kept company
at 6 PM Capt Brown came on board and
told us the news & heading S by E under 12.3
struck a porpoise saw nothing else

Thursday 25th Boms with light Easterly winds
and thick fog all sail set the American
Lat 52.35 in company middle part lights up and
Lon 166.58 saw several humpbacks in sight at 12 m
hacked to the S. E. at 8 took in the main sail
and stood sea watches

Friday 26th Boms with light winds from the
Lat 52.06 S. W. and thick fog running off N. E. a few
no humpbacks in sight at 8 PM to the topsail
and set boats crew watches

Saturday 27th Boms with light S. Westerly winds
on run in with thick foggy spells running to the N. E. under
sight to which topsails saw several humpbacks

whale ground. S. F. Barnum master 1846
Sunday June 28th Boms with strong westerly winds with fog
Lat 52.23 running off to the N. E. Eastward under
Lon 161.15.1. whose topsails saw nothing

Monday 29th Boms with calm middle and later parts light
Lat 53.30 Easterly winds and pleasant saw nothing at 8 PM
Lon 160.43 took in the main and M. G. heading S by E

Tuesday 30th Boms with strong Easterly winds and
hazy at 6 subreefed the topsails middle and
no ch and later parts light winds from the southward
with thick fog wore ship to the S. E. at 6 PM

Wednesday July 1st Boms with light S. westerly winds
Lat 52.06 and thick fog running off N. E. under all
sail saw nothing middle and later parts the
same so ends the 1st of July 1846

Thursday the 2nd Boms with strong westerly winds
Lat 52.46 and pleasant spoke the Hercules Capt
Lon 157.44 betters of N. B. 2 whales saw 2 other ships
spoke none of them the title of N. B. 8 m. and
4 whales have not seen a whale this 7 days

Friday 3rd Boms with light S. E. winds and thick
Lat 53.04 fog middle lights up saw the Hercules;
Lon 156.48 boats chasing whales. lowered the S. W. and B.
Boats and chased him a spell then came on
board 3 ships in sight shorten sail at 8

Saturday 4th Boms with strong winds from the
Lat 52.55 S. W. and foggy run off to the N. E. saw some
Lon 154.24 finbacks and 4 ships at 6 PM spoke the
Dev Group Cap Silver of N. B. 2.4 m. out 5000
4 whales this season shot a seal shorten sail

Sunday 5th Boms with strong westerly winds and pleasant
Lat 53.03 running to the N. E. under all sail saw a few
Lon 151.15 finbacks shorten sail at 8 PM heading to the N. E.
