Thursday 9th Strong Gales from the Nward with
no L very heavy sea heading Eastward under
at 10 AM and 11 AM. Thick and rainy

Friday 10th Strong northerly winds and thick fog
at 4 AM kept off S.S.W. and made sail according
to the wind run all day at 8 PM shorten sail

Saturday 11th Boms with strong northerly winds
and foggy whol topsails steering S.W.
at 8 PM shorten sail and dub for heading S.W.

Sunday 12th Boms with light S.W. winds and
at 10 AM spoke the Offert Tyler of Edgartown
at 12 noon spoke the 2 sea out 3 whales this day
Lon 145.32 at 12. 1 to day let her have a bunch
of craft. shorten sail heading S.W. 52

Monday 13th Boms with light westerly winds and
at 5 PM foggy at 9 PM raised right whales lowered
Lon 145.32 the boat, and galley them. at 10 PM spoke
the 3 whales of N.B. 4 whales. at 4 PM lowered again
for whales the 2 boat struck the west boat got
stuck the 2 boat and came on board. Disturbance
on board. can not tell for sure and shorten sail

saw none ship at 8 PM.
the mate off duty and the crew in a state
little better then meeting

Thursday 16th Boms with light westerly winds
Lat 50.48 and thick fog heading N.W. middle part light
Lon 149.35 saw 12 ships whaling later part heading
south saw some finbacks shorten sail
heading N.W. the ships company more quiet

Friday 17th Boms with light S.W. winds
Lat 50.48 and foggy heading N.W. saw none
Lon 149.35 ship middle part lights up at 1 PM lowered
for right whales. 3 boats did not fasten
saw plenty of finbacks. shorten sail at 5 PM
to S.E. topsails thick and rainy

Saturday 18th Boms with strong westerly winds
Lat 50.48 and foggy heading S spoke the "George & Mark"
Lon 150.12 of N.B. Capt Beards 4 whales 300 11 mo out
at 9 AM backed to the N.W. middle saw 4 ships
to leeward no whales

Sunday 19th Boms with light westerly winds and
Lat 50.31 hazy heading South at 1 PM raised a right
Lon no whale lowered 3 boats the Bow boat struck and
in 2 hours had him secure along side
commenced cutting at 1 PM at 6 PM the blanket
piece tore off and let him lay saw a bark

Monday 20th light westerly winds and hazy at
9 AM wore round commenced cutting at 10 PM
finished after having very bad luck saw
1 ship at 10 PM started the works
in rolling the whale see part of a 4 inch rope and
the ship to a top block which tore in the 10 PM
