Friday August 7th Bore with light variable winds from
Lat 38.28 N the N and E. at 5 AM lost a man overboard ship
Lat 38.28 N going about 1000 the S Boat and picked him
up. Middle part the same as the first watches
employed fitting rigging and setting up Mast

Saturday 8th Light Baffling winds from the S and E heading
Lat 36.48 from S to S.W. all sail set saw nothing watches
Lat 35.52 employed picking up men and various other duty

Sunday 9th light variable winds from the Southward
Lat 36.14 and pleasant heading S.W. at 5 AM tacked to the
Lat 35.32 Eastward saw nothing remarkable

Monday 10th light breezes from the S.E. and pleasant
Lat 36.16 heading Eastward at 8 PM spoke the brig Mary
Lat 35.46 of Hobbs from 50 lbs this season

Tuesday 11th light variable winds from Southward
Lat 36.05 and calm saw nothing in sight but the brig
Lat 35.27 at 8 PM heading S.W. with Lar tacks on board

Wednesday 12th Bore with light winds and pleasant
all sail set heading S.E. Lar tacks on board
the Mary a stern dis 5 miles. Later part brisk
breezes from the E.N.E. going about the Mary at
6 PM a stern dis 15 miles so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 13th Bore with brisk breezes from the
Lat 35.12 N.E. and pleasant. all sail set but S to S.W.
Lat 35.13 spoke out between decks aft and cleaned out
Middle and later parts the same as first

Friday 14th Bore with brisk breezes from the N.E. &
Lat 36.70 attended with squall of rain broke out the
Lat 35.28 blue room and covered the deck. Later part
light winds steering S.E. all sail set

Saturday 15th Bore with light Easterly winds & pleasant
Lat 29.17 steering S.E. all sail set saw some porpoises
Lat 35.24 cane faster ranging high

Lat 35.24 Sandwich Is Capt S. Barnum 1846
Sunday Aug 10th Bore and middle parts light & Easterly winds
Lat 28.17 with light squalls at 6 PM strong breezes from
Lat 35.27 East all sail set steering S.E.

Monday 17th Light variable winds from S.E. & with squall
Lat 27.11 of rain set up the fore dory and fitted a pearl
Lat 35.54 rope for M. & yard it washed the Lar side S.E.

Tuesday 18th Light N.E. trades and pleasant steering
Lat 25.20 S.E. all sail set raised a breeze at 12 M and lifted
Lat 35.07 Port did not see it again washed off the Lar side
bunched the boom of the first whale 13 bunches
and 40 pounds at 6 PM light squall off rain

Wednesday 19th Light N.E. trades all this day steering
Lat 23.24 S.E. at 4 PM deep off S.W. all necessary
Lat 35.43 sail set so ends these 24 hours

Thursday 20th brisk trade winds from N.E. and pleasant
Lat 29.55 at 6 PM raised the land a head steering S.W.
Lat 35.12 and a sail at 8 PM strong squall

Friday 21th Strong trades and squally at 5 PM off
the passage runner spoke the Che. 110 lbs
this season run in and came to at 2 PM
in 15 fathoms went on shore and found water
and 3 papers and plenty for others

Saturday 22nd in Port discharged 170 men and mate
the Morea came in full bound home

Sunday 23rd pleasant the Star watch on liberty
Monday 24th pleasant broke out the provisions including
cup pipes shipped 6618 lbs of bone aboard the Angola

Tuesday 25th pleasant breaking out stores and showing
down shook 9 ships came in and 2 gone out

Wednesday 26th pleasant got off a raft of water
Thursday 27th pleasant employed in ships duty
Friday 28th the same
Saturday 29th got off a raft of water and fitted
the windvane several ships arrived and sailed 26 being 6
