 at 4 AM double reef the topsails at 9 AM took the

 breezes from the southward at 6 PM
 were ship to S. W. S. set the double reef
 V & D sail & D. at 5 AM wood topsails
 at 10 AM all sail set a heavy sea run-
 ing from the southward wind light

 Sunday Nov 1st Boms with light wind
 from the Southward with heavy sea
 all sail set heading S. E. S. at 6 AM
 Lower all the boats for Blackfish
 at 8 came onboard for breakfast with
 5 fish lost from alongside at 10 lowered
 again got 5 the S. E. S. the L. B. S. the W. B. 2 the B. B. S.
 saw a hump back and several other schools
 of blackfish wind light heading S. W. Lat 33.34 Lon 155.1
