

**Bark Warsaw from San Est 1844**  
 Monday Nov 2<sup>d</sup> Boms with light breezes from the Eastward and pleasant heading S 84 W cleared away the blackfish Sata's part. Boiled them out turned up 10 bolls Breering South with light breeze Lat 33.41.0 Lon 154.50.0

Tuesday 3<sup>d</sup> light breezes from the Eastward and calm Middle and later parts, the same steering S Lat 34.20 S Lon 154.21 Content the flying gill and sent in the boom repaired the sail

Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> Begins with pleasant breezes from the Eastward steering S with all sail set at 3 PM lowered the 3 Lar boats for blackfish could not get fast Middle part light winds & pleasant Later part the same sail on Lat 36.09 Lon 154.15.0

Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> Boms with fine breezes from the Northward & pleasant steering S 84 W all sail out that will draw saw a bark heading west finished mending the S 84 Later part strong breezes offering NW 84 saw a humpback at 5<sup>th</sup> morning and run off tried to make a square head of him Lat 37.05 Lon 154.4

Friday 6<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong N Westerly winds & pleasant steering NW 84 with all sail set but the mizy mthing to do and nobody to help do it. Cape How bearing NW 84 dis 75 miles by Chronometer at 8 PM Reep of S 84 W at 10 AM took in the 3 Lar at 11 PM saw a topsail schooner steering westward fitted a shackle and several other things Lat 38.54 Lon 150.00

Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong breezes from N steering S 84 W at 6 PM wild appearance in main 84 and dull reef the topsails middle equal later part moderates bent the main 84 topsail and made sail as the wind went down Lat 40.33 Lon 150.12

**Towards Macquarie's Id. St Barren**  
 Sunday Nov 8<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong breezes from west under double reef top heading S 84 at 4 PM all sail set saw several finbacks at 12 Light wind from the NW at 4 AM strong breezes at 9 AM saw a school of blackfish and several finbacks Lat 42.05 S Lon 150.18.0

Monday 9<sup>th</sup> Boms with brisk breezes from the NW and hazy at 4 PM wind hals to the Eastward heading South with all sail set saw a ship to seaward heading Northward Middle part light winds at 5 AM sent the new main topsail light wind from S 84 W saw a ship steering N 84 at 10 AM strong winds dull reefed the 84 W took the top 3 Lar sails in last night at 8 PM Lat 43.14 Lon 150.01

Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> Begins with strong S W winds with heavy sea at 4 PM dull reefed the 84 W handed the 84 W. 84 W mainsail heading S 84 ship laboring hard & shipping some water on deck at 8 PM more moderate but heavy sea Middle more moderate made sail as the wind goes down at 8 AM sent the 3 Lar top gallant mast and yard down on the 84 W sail at 11 AM dull & single reef topsail wind increasing with heavy swell saw 84 W Lat 44.42 Lon 150.44

Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong winds from the S W with heavy swell sail as above steering S 84 at 10 PM took in topsails at 8 AM sent the 84 W & repaired it made 84 W topsail & sent another Lat 45.42 Lon 150.44

Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> Boms with light moderate winds and cloudy steering S 84 at 8 PM dull reefed the 84 W at 8 handed the 84 W later part light winds at 8 AM all sail set so ends these 24 hours took a lunar 30 miles from here Lat 47.50 Lon 150.33

Friday 13<sup>th</sup> light winds from N at 5 PM wind hals to S heading S 84 in NW Middle & later part calm employees repairing sails & turning close pins Lat 49.00 Lon 151.14
