

Remarks onboard Bark Warsaw
 Saturday 14th Nov. Bore with calm at 6 AM
 light winds from N.E. steering S.E.
 Middle & latter parts the same, sparring sails
 Lat 48.48 Lon 151.03 E
 Sunday 15th Bore with fine breeze from
 the N.E. & pleasant took the fore down
 and put the 1st oil stowage deck taken
 the 1st of this month. Middle part wind
 calm to the westward at 8 AM and S.W. all
 sail in but close reef. Major spread of 1800
 parted main 1st sheet heavy squalls of hail
 shipping heavy seas laying broad of
 Lat 50.27 Lon 151.08
 Monday 16th Bore with strong gales from
 the S.W. and heavy sea at 4 AM moderate made
 sail as the wind abated. Middle part light
 winds from N.W. & calm later part
 light winds from S.W. course S.E. & S
 Lat 51.08 Lon 152.00
 Tuesday 17th Bore with brisk breezes
 from the Northward & clearer steering
 S.E. & S. at 6 PM banded the main sail & 1st
 Middle part thick fog & raining later the same
 Lat 53.30 Lon 152.15 course S.E.
 Wednesday 18th Bore with thick hazy weather
 fine W.S.W. steering S.E. & S. all sail set
 will draw sea which is as above & dull day
 W.S.W. Middle duble reef M.G. at 4 AM made
 sail later part brisk winds from N.W.
 Lat 54.28 Lon 153.30 course S.E.
 Thursday 19th Bore with strong breezes from
 N.W. and cloudy all sail set that will
 draw steering S. Middle part strong breezes
 from the westward at 8 AM made Macquarie
 to south point 14 miles held up for the
 Northward and 12 steering down the
 land at 4 PM off the S.E. point saw
 ing but Penguins were ship heading
 back to the Northward at 1 PM passed a
 bend. there we saw the remains of houses
 everybody's faces as long as my arm
 and lower as downy glass Lat 54.28 Lon 158.58 E
 4601

While at Macquarie Is 1840
 Friday Nov 20th Bore with strong winds
 from the N.W. and cloudy off the N.E. point
 of Macquarie's Is. running down the land
 saw a rock 3 miles off the N. point in running
 down the land saw Penguins on all the
 beaches at 4 PM off the S.E. point saw
 elephant seal ship to the Northward the
 Star shore boat duble reef topsail
 at 9 PM fetched in under the N. Point and came
 in 125 fms at 4 PM. Mr Carr went on shore and
 brought off some eggs and saw several elephant
 got under weigh and came in 15 fms at
 Saturday 21st at 11 PM got up the large anchor
 & stowed it at 3 PM let it go 2 boats went on shore
 saw about 20 elephant later part strong wind
 from the S.W. with squalls of sleet & hail
 Sunday 22nd strong gales from the S.W.
 and squalls of hail at 2 PM went on shore
 with 2 boats brought off 2 elephants came on
 board at 4 PM. saw about 50 elephants
 there is 11 traps on shore and a anchor the
 remains of houses in one several other things
 at 6 PM fresh gales from W.S.W. obliging the
 Lar anchor at 9 PM the Star anchor brought
 her up in 23 ft strong squalls the rest of the day
 Monday 23rd strong gales and squalls at 4 PM
 moderate 2 boats went on shore for eggs
 the other to repair a house came off at 8 PM
 Tuesday at 8 AM sent the main 1st yard down
 strong gales all these 24 hours
 Wednesday 24th Bore with strong gales and squalls
 at 3 PM 2 boats started to go on shore the Lar boat
 came back and gave it up the Star boat came on
 and got some eggs fetched new ways for the boats 9 PM
 later part the same
 This Island is laid down 50 miles to the W of our shore
