

Bark Warsaw crossing the
Tuesday Jan 5th Come with light winds from
N.W. & attended by light mist & rain at 4 A.M.
tacked to the Square at 8 A.M. steering S.W. &
under all sail wind S.W. at 1 P.M. put
James Brown in irons for insolence to the Capt.
all the hands forward but 2. 17 off duty. and John
at 6 in main sail gave the men a cake of
bread and a pot of water each and spiked them
down. No observations this day

Wednesday 6th Light winds from west & pleasant
steering East. we put 2 more of the men in irons
the rest went to their duty after they found that
they could not share their own way

Lat 47.01 S Lon 175.25 East
Thursday 7th Light winds from west by N
and pleasant sent up the main & mast
& yard & mis. top mast 2 men got their irons
off Bill Alden & Rely and threw them overboard
Made some more and put them on
cow S.W. Lat 47.20 Lon 177.13 East
At 8 P.M. examined the prisoners and found
that Brown and Alden had filed their irons off
put on some more and separated them

Friday 8th Come with strong winds from N.W.
with light squalls of rain at 7 A.M. Dr. Mc G. & sail
middle part wind shifts to the southward at 3 P.M.
out reefs at 8 P.M. wind N.W. main sail and
Sail in. the prisoners quiet and still
passed Bounty Island about 1/2 3 this morning

Lat 47.25 Lon 178.25 west
Saturday 9th Come with brisk breezes from N.W. &
and pleasant sent up the fore & Salant mast
and yard bent the main & Salant sail & set it
middle & later parts wind & weather the same
cow S.W. Lat 47.43 S Lon 179.45 W

Sunday 10th All this day brisk breezes from
N.W. steering S.W. under all sail that will
allow which is 1 main top sail main & Salant top
fore sail & 2 top sail the rest furled heavy swell
Lat 47.42 S Lon 179.15 W

Pacific Ocean to Cape Horn 1841
Monday Jan 11th Come with brisk breezes from
N.W. and cloudy at 4 P.M. all sail set steering
S.W. Middle part wind increases at 11 in
main & Salant sail at 5 P.M. Dub key topsails
ship steering very wild

Lat 47.50 S Lon 179.50 W
Tuesday 12th Come with strong gales from N.W. &
thick at 4 P.M. moderated made all sail middle
wind west brisk breeze sent out flying jib
at 8 P.M. in main sail cow S.W. Lat 48.00 S
No Observations

Wednesday 13th Strong gales from N.W. with squalls
of rain at 2 A.M. in M.P. at 6 set it again
middle part heavy sea running later part the
same cow S.W. Lat 48.53 Lon 180.56

Thursday 14th Strong gales from west with squalls
of rain veil as above shifted the iron hoops
into the run cow S.W. Lat 48.57 Lon 181.28

Friday 15th Come with brisk breezes from N.W.
with light squalls of rain steering S.W. with
all sail out that will draw made a 16 & 8 mile
and bent it later part light winds and
pleasant Lat 48.52 Lon 180.17

Saturday 16th Light breezes from N.W. and clear
sent up the Salant sail & set it. then stowed
the anchors afresh later part wild appearance
course S.W. at 9 P.M. in 4 P.M. Lat 48.53 Lon 180.40

Sunday 17th Come with strong winds from N.W.
all sail out but 2 P.M. at 11 A.M. in 4 P.M. Salant sail
& middle part wind shifts to North and increases
at 2 P.M. in 4 P.M. Salant sail double reefed the top sail
at 4 P.M. all sail but close reefed 2 top sail & main
in blowing great guns no observations this day

Monday 18th at 4 P.M. more moderate made
sail strong winds from N.W. all this day all sail
out at 12 Later part in top Salant sail
course S.W. Lat 49.52 Lon 182.34 (What from Drunken)
