

From Cape Horn to  
Friday Feb 5<sup>th</sup> Boms with light winds from S.E.  
and calm at 2 P.M. wind hals S.W. with  
a brisk breeze steering N.E. wet & rainy

Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> Boms with light winds from S.W.  
and cloudy at 8 A.M. saw a school of black fish  
at 10 saw Staten land on the S. then steering  
N.E. wind hals to the N.W. raised up all sails  
Lat 54 54 Lon 62 19 W

Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> Boms with brisk breezes from W.N.W. and  
pleasant at 8 all sail out heading N.W. still left  
saw several finbacks struck a porpoise to him. Middle  
part wind hals W.S.W. at 6 P.M. strong breeze  
Doubt to repairs at 8 keep off East  
Lat 52 54 Lon 60 59

Monday 8<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong gales from S.W.  
and thick at 4 A.M. took in sail and hove to  
heading N.E. waiting for weather to go in to the  
Banks at 12 merid. thick wind hals to the  
Westward made all sail keel off N.E. for  
Rio Janeiro The Banksland Co. bearing N.W. 45 or  
50 miles distant carried away our top stay  
Lat 52 47 9 Lon 56 52 40

Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> Boms with brisk breezes from West and  
pleasant all sail set steering N.W. middle  
part wind hals to the N.W. later part sharp  
chill just going our course saw one or 2 finbacks  
fitted the top stay at 10 P.M. Lat 51 1/2 Lon 55 1/2

Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> Boms with brisk breezes from  
N.W. and thick weather heading W.S.W.  
at 12 lights up S.W. thick fog with rain at 10 P.M.  
took in sail to S.W. & hove to in N.W. Lat 50 26 Lon 50 00

Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> Boms with light breeze from S.E. with  
thick fog at 5 A.M. made sail wind hals to S.W.  
and attended with light squalls of rain  
Lat 48 Lon 54 32

Friday 12<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong breezes from W.S.W.  
with light squalls of rain later part wind hals  
to N.W. all sail out steering N.W. saw great  
many finbacks Lat 46 10 Lon 48 49

Rio de Janeiro  
Saturday Feb 15<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong gales from west  
with squalls of sail attended with lightning at 1 P.M.  
took in the top & mainsail being under double reef  
at 2 heavy squalls wind hals to N.W. and light all the  
rest of the day on bent G. & Salontail and repaired it  
made a new jere rope for the yard struck 2 porpoises  
and lost them chased a finback and made him meet  
and several other things to numerous to mention  
Lon 44 50 Lat 44 50 Lon 45 55 W

Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> Boms with light breezes from S.W.  
and pleasant this morning at 4 P.M. passed a ship  
steering S.W. at 8 P.M. all sail out steering N.W.  
at 12 merid keep off N.E. light winds all this day  
Lat 42 30 Lon 44 57

Monday 15<sup>th</sup> Boms with light breeze from S.W. and  
pleasant all sail set heading N.W. at 12 merid  
wind hals to N.E. making N.W. saw the wreck  
of a boat that appeared to have been stove  
by a whale. lowered down and examined it  
it appeared to be a Eastern built boat with  
bushings and blocks catted top mast stem sail boom  
and sent them aloft forward this morning  
saw a school of grampus passed great quantity  
of whale birds yesterday and to day and saw some  
whale feed at 8 P.M. brisk breeze in N.E. Lat  
40 20 Lon 44 30

Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong breezes from N.E.  
and pleasant at 8 A.M. in top Gallon boats carried  
away the top stay fitted it and set the top at  
2 P.M. light breeze all sail out but S.W. sharp on  
the wind heading N.W. watches employed making gun  
garn and various other duty Lat 38 57 Lon 44 17

Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> Boms with strong breezes from  
N.E. and pleasant heading N.W. under whoob  
top sails Middle wind hals to S.E. passed  
the bark on to other tack repaired the main  
& Salontail hauled at 9 Lat 37 22 Lon 45 45

Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> Boms with light breeze from the  
westward at 4 wind hals N.W. at 8 wind S.W. fitted  
Lower and top mast steering sails and set them at  
at 2 wind hals S.W. shifted stowails Lat 36 30 Lon 46 57
