

Bark Warsaw Laying at Rio de Janeiro
Tuesday March 2^d Laying in port washed ship

Wednesday 3^d Laying in port the Lar watch
went on shore for liberty the prisoners went
on shore to the Consul at 5 PM the boat came
on shore for the men the Capt being there at
the time that the boat was a going to start off
he and none of the men had some words
about going aboard which ended in
a clinch Mr Carr and myself and 3 men
went aboard the Capt came shortly after

Thursday 4th the Lar watch on liberty
at night 4 men came off

Friday 5th the Capt and Mr Carr on shore
on business came off at night

Saturday 6th this day Mr Carr got his discharge
and took his things on shore the Capt and
some of the men came on board with a
stranger got some weather potatoes and other
small stores left 3 men forward on shore
at 8 PM the men forward had a drunken
brawl put a ship to it 8 PM the 3 men on shore run away

Sunday 7th this morning hove up our
anchor to go to sea it came up very foul
light wind off the land strong S.W. tide
drifted down land to a island in the
passage let go the other anchor and waited
till flood tide cleared our anchor and hove
up the other and stood out into the passage
and came to in 18 fms the Bazar of Boston came in

Monday 8th this morning the Capt went to the
fort for a pass word which was permit weighed our
anchor and stood out by the lower fort gave the pass
word and stood to sea fine light breeze off S.W.
at 6 PM the Sugar Loaf bearing N.W. 1/2 S. 20 miles
at 8 PM the light in sight 2 1/2 miles 28 men all healthy
3 off duty sick 4 passengers Henry Cochrane

Homesward Bound

Tuesday March 9th Moderate breeze from the N and to all the
day heading from E to S.S. heavy swell 18.58 & 44.48
in all the middle at 6 PM all sail set heading S.W.
from 8 PM till 12 calm Lat 24.09 S Lon 41.52 E

Wednesday 10th Come with light winds from S.W.
with rain rose N.E. at 4 PM wind shifts to the
Eastward and variable at 2 PM in top of clouds
raining all day constant showers of rain through the
night heading N.W. the most of the time no show

Thursday 11th Come with strong breeze from S.W.
with rain at 4 PM shifts to the N.E. in a
squal raining great guns were around the wind
battering at 8 PM heading on the tack that had the
most Eastward set the main S.W. middle part heading
N found by obs that there was a strong current
setting southward took the bonnet off the gal and
ordered the 8 PM and repaired it sickness
fever begins to make its appearance some sick
Lat 20.58 Lon 41.35

Friday 12th Come with light baffling winds from
the Eastward all sail set at 6 PM heading S.S.
middle part light breeze at 4 PM light wind
from S.W. heading N.W. & E. Later

Come looking for whale Lat 23.27 Lon 41.09
Saturday 13th All this day heavy wind as
usual heading the S.E. the most of the day
showers of rain no observations

Sunday 14th Come with light winds from
the S.E. heading from East to S.E. with constant
squalls of rain at 8 PM heavy squall tacked
to the N.W. at 2 PM tacked to the S.E. took
in the 8 PM sail & 8 PM Lat 24.28 Lon 39.04

Monday 15th Come with fresh breeze from S.W.
with squalls of wind and rain at 8 PM in a squall of
Mr Allen fell down the after hatchway and hurt
his side bad at 10 PM saw a bark steering S.W. at 10 PM
in main S.W. sail on D.R. the 8 PM sail middle constant
squall of rain at 8 PM left the main S.W. sail bent a little
at 8 PM calm at 9 light breeze from S.W. all sail set at 10 PM
