

Remarks on Thursday August 14th 1820

This morning comes in with fresh breeze and squally with rain. plenty fish and no bait - one boat gone to sandwich bay for bait - caught 1104 fish 70 days from Portland

Remarks on Friday August 15th 1820

This morning begins with thick weather got no bait at Humberston - so we catch no fish - sent one boat a wooding - caught 136 fish 79 days from Portland

Remarks on Saturday August 16th 1820

This morning comes in with fresh breeze and rainy weather - no bait to be caught so we catch no fish - latter part heavy gale 80 days from Portland

Remarks on Sunday August 17th 1820

This morning comes in with tremendous gale and rough sea attended with heavy rain and squally latter part Breeze - 81 days from Portland

Remarks on Monday August 18th 1820

This morning begins with fresh breeze from the N.E. no bait to be got - so all hands employed in getting ready for sea secured blubber butt got in whale boat secured the hold &c so ends the day - 82 days from Portland

Remarks on Tuesday August 19th 1820

This morning commences with light wind at sea at 9 AM got under weigh in company with Capt Low - bound to Churney Isles and at 6 AM came to anchor in Grady Harbour made ship and so forth with the wind at S.E. Latter part thick weather - 1 day from Long Island and 83 from Portland

Remarks on Wednesday August 20th 1820

This morning comes in with fresh gale and rainy weather got out whale boat and sent two boats a fishing caught 200 fish - so ends this day with fresh gale and plenty of rain 2 days from Long Island and 84 from Portland

Remarks on Thursday August 21st 1820

This morning comes in with tremendous gale and thick rainy weather still lying in Grady Harbour - so ends the day 3 days from Long Island and 85 from Portland

Remarks on Friday August 22nd 1820

This morning comes in with light winds and variable - Capt Low got under weigh and returned again with the wind at S.E. Latter part thick weather so ends this day 4 days from Long Island and 86 from Portland

Remarks on Saturday August 23rd 1820

This day begins with clearing weather and calm filled some water sent two boats a fishing caught 417 fish Latter part calm - 5 days from Long Island and 87 from Portland

Remarks on Sunday August 24th 1820

This morning begins with thick weather and head wind. a number of vessels came to in the road waiting for a fair wind bound home Latter part rainy - 6 days from Long Island and 88 from Portland

Remarks on Monday August 25th 1820

This morning comes in with pleasant breeze and good weather at 6 AM got under weigh from Grady Harbour in company with a number of vessels - Having 3 B.C. for Indian Pickle - from Otto to Spotted Head 55 E. at Muechen passed it - so ends these 24 hours 7 days from Long Island and 89 from Portland
