

2. Remarks on board the ship Washington

Sunday the 11th the first part of these 24 hours moderate breeze and pleasant weather a man was sent aloft to look over the rigging the 2nd part quite calm the last part light breeze heading ESE

Monday the 12th the first part part calm and warm the 2nd part much the same the last part moderate breeze steering ESE all hands fitting the boat

Tuesday the 13th the first part the wind blew strong from south west the 2nd part we took a reef in the top sails and furled the 3rd the last part we turned about the reef was up after the weather became cloudy and began to lighten and the wind blew very hard and we were in all sail again it lasted 2 ours after that we got under way with a moderate breeze heading ESE

Wednesday the 14th the first part moderate breeze and pleasant the 2nd part quite calm all hands busy making mats and setting up rigging the last part much the same

Thursday the 15th moderate breeze and pleasant weather the 2nd part the ship was under way and the last part headwinds heading ESE

Friday the 16th light breeze and pleasant the 2nd part calm and very warm the 3rd part moderate breeze and quite steering ESE

Saturday the 17th the first part in a heavy rain the wind on the starboard beam and a school of porpoises the 2nd part the wind hauled E and rain of through the night

Sunday the 18th the first part of these 24 hours the wind increased to a gale we hauled the top of the main and fore the reefs the top sails and hauled to the remainder of the 24 hours

Monday the 19th the first part it still blew very hard the last part we got under way and stood by

Tuesday the 20th the first part of heavy weather I sent up the top of the main and fore and a new main sail course ESE and quite calm

Wednesday the 21st the first part pleasant and calm the last part moderate breeze all hands employed in various jobs in ships duty heading ESE

Thursday the 22nd the first part light breeze and pleasant the last part moderate breeze and up and down on all sail steering to the

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Friday the 23rd the first part part calm and pleasant the 2nd part part calm and pleasant the last part part calm and pleasant

Saturday the 24th lat 32° 29' N long 152° 32' W the first part of these 24 hours light breeze and pleasant the 2nd part of these 24 hours heavy rain and a school of porpoises the last part of these 24 hours light breeze and pleasant

Sunday the 25th the first part pleasant breeze ship to the last part light breeze and pleasant lat 36° 28' N long 133° 11' W

Monday the 26th the first part light breeze and pleasant the last part fair wind heading ESE lat 31° 11' N

Tuesday the 27th lat 32° 13' N the first part headwinds very heavy the last part part calm and pleasant heading ESE

Wednesday the 28th the first part headwinds the last part much the same and a heavy fall of rain in most heading ESE

Thursday the 29th lat 36° 44' N long 139° 8' W these 24 hours fair wind and pleasant weather

Friday the 30th course SE by E the first part we did fine late sail breeze the last part quite calm

Saturday the 31st course SE by E lat 34° 32' N the first part of these 24 hours we had a fair wind but light the last part
