Sunday Jan the 25th in lat 40. 16. S. Long 147.

The first part of these 23 hours commenced clear and bright with a fine
Breeze from the North East and part pleasant and warm with a low
sea Breeze from the North East part of the day and warmer with
a gentle Breeze from the N. E. and a heavy rain of fine immixtures, fell
from the ships every evening & by 5

Saturday Jan 26th in lat 42° 33' - long 53°

The first part of these 24 hours, pleasant with the wind S by W. Heaving S by S. Standard Watch below and now saw several whale about the ship, two of which came near the ship and among her schools of porpoises came a long line heaving S by E. The last part pleasant and calm with heaving S by E.

the first part of these 24 hours I spent with a fine breeze from N. by E. bearing S. S. E. The 2nd part sent up the mizen & galant yard and the foretop mast and mizen top galant & tindersails. The last part fine weather & sailing beautifully with a 6 ribbon. At 5 AM what she took to be land appearing all but was disappointed. No sail numbers in sight.

Sunday February the 3rd in 50^g 4 m. 18 lat 63, 20. 41 long
