

Remarks on Board the ship Washington

Saturday Sept the 21st all these 24 hours the weather
gales and squalls at 4 o'clock of the night
left for the port March at 6 in the morning
sailed out the reefs from the main and mizen top sails

Sunday Sept the 22nd

the first part of these
24 hours fresh breeze the 2nd part fresh breezes and
west squalls the last part more moderate steering
east under all sails

Monday Sept the 23rd

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather
at 2 o'clock raised a gale which blew the vessel about
that point sail which again the 2nd part light airs
and cloudy weather the gales of wind began
surging the 3rd part at 9 am. at a moderate pace

Tuesday Sept the 24th the first part of these
24 hours pleasant breeze the 2nd part much the same
the last part fresh breeze with some milder of fresh fish
steering to the southward

Wednesday Sept the 25th

the first part of these
24 hours moderate breeze the 2nd part much the same
the last part fresh breeze with a number of fine
tackles and black fish

Thursday Sept the 26th

all these 24 hours light
breeze and cloudy weather steering to the southward

Friday Sept the 27th lat 40 30

the first part of these 24 hours gentle
breeze and cloudy weather the 2nd part fresh breeze the last
part all the same breeze the top gales of sails flying and
masted up the main sail still heading to the southward

Saturday the 28th lat 40 30 the first part of these 24
hours fresh breeze raised a gale at 10 am the 2nd part fresh
breeze the last part at night of the ship took in the
sails and of fair weather

Sunday Sept the 29th the first part of

these 24 hours fresh breeze this day gained with the pilot
the 2nd part cloudy the last part

Monday the 30th lat 41 30

all these 24 hours moderate
breeze at 6 am when we took in the sails and steering to
the southward and courses

Tuesday the 1st Oct the first part of these 24 hours fresh
gales the 2nd part much the same the last part
fresh breeze and squalls heading to the southward

After leaving Charles Island

Wednesday October the 2nd lat 41 30 long 87 57

all these 24 hours commences fresh gales which came with
squalls and heavy winds heading to the north west and
westward

Thursday the 3rd lat 40 30

the first part of these 24
hours fresh breeze and squalls at 7 am of the ship
bore the 2nd part of moderate breeze with squalls out 12 am
the 3rd part of moderate breeze with squalls at 10 am the 4th part
the last part moderate breeze at 11 am

Friday the 4th the first part of these 24 hours
commences with fresh breeze and squalls the later part
of moderate breeze

Saturday the 5th the first part of these 24 hours
commences with fresh breeze at 4 pm towards the port
but with our sails the later part fresh breeze at 6 am and a sail
on our weather beam with barbed ducks on board

Sunday the 6th lat 40 30 long 88 30

all these 24 hours
pleasant weather and moderate breeze

from the 6th to the 10th we moderate breeze and pleasant
weather Thursday the 10th lat 40 30 long 88 30
pleasant breeze and pleasant weather at 10 o'clock fresh breeze
and squalls and a gale that 35 was by the city square

Friday the 11th

pleasant breeze and pleasant weather
the 2nd part saw the Limas sailors
of the ship the 3rd part we boarded ship and found the
chief of the Limas a large whale in killing him she got
the chief of the mouth and more saw him after

Saturday the 12th lat 40 30 the first part
pleasant breeze and fine weather this day
saw a whale towards the captain and made
down from the main deck to the crew on the
main deck where we were at 10 am the
whale and after a while of 6 ours we captured his
head and 7 barrels

Sunday the 13th
the first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather commences
with fresh breeze the 2nd part moderate breeze in trying
the last part much the same
